

**BOARD OF SELECTMEN**  
**Meeting Highlights**

**June 25, 2018**

**CALL TO ORDER:** Sonny opened the Meeting at 7:00 PM with the flag salute.

**SELECTMEN IN ATTENDANCE:**

Sonny LePage, Joanne Andrews, Gil Harris, Wendy Thorne, Dottie Richard.

**MINUTES:**

- Wendy made a **motion** to approve the Meeting Highlights of June 18, 2018. Gil **seconded** the motion. **Passed** 3-0 with one abstention.

**DEPARTMENT REPORTS:**

Lisa LePage, Parks and Rec – Sarah Castle, a 35 year old Special Ed teacher, is the new swimming instructor. Lessons will start July 10<sup>th</sup> and will be for four weeks. The lessons will be held at the Public Beach from 1 pm to 4 pm Tuesday through Thursday. There will be three groups, beginner, intermediate and advanced. Sammy Dudley, a junior, who teaches swimming at the YMCA, is looking to make some summer money to buy a car would also like to help teach swimming. The fee will be \$30 per person per week or \$100 for the month or \$50 per week per family or \$175 for the month per family. Lisa feels with these fees all costs should be covered. Tumbling is doing well. RC Graphic has completed the new signs for the Ball Park and Public Beach.

Jason Johnson, Fire Dept. – June 12 the Department celebrated the retirement of Greg LePage. Jason also wanted to thank the Historical Society for the Presentation on the History of the Limerick Fire Dept. Jason and Adam Mason attended training this past weekend on “Train the Trainer”.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

- Risk Policy for the Rec Dept. Dottie will look into what information is required. Joanne **motion** to approve the policy, Dottie **seconded**. **Passed** 5 – 0.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

- Thank you to Michael Carroll for the cleaning and mowing at the overlook and replacing the trash barrel at the Overlook.
- Jack Taylor from Wildwood Acres Subdivision is requesting Foss Road speed limit to be lowered. Joanne suggested that DOT do a speed study. Dottie **motioned** for DOT to do the study on the entire Foss Road, Gil **seconded**, Passed 4 – 0. Sonny didn’t vote.

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- The Board signed the Deed for Map 41 Lots 118 – 124
- Approve renewal for computer back-up subscription from Modem Wavs, Inc. for \$829.99. Joanne **motioned** to approve, Gil **seconded**. **Passed** 5 – 0.
- Dale McMillan is requesting to purchase lots that are listed for July auction that abut his property – Map 46 Lots 44 through 49. The Board approved his purchase in the amount of \$1,500.

**WARRANT:**

- Wendy **motioned** to accept the warrants of June 25<sup>th</sup> warrant Joanne **seconded** it **passed** 5 – 0

Gil asked if Sonny looked into the lawn care company and what chemicals were used. Sonny spoke to one of the workers in the office and they will get back to him this week and they will tell us what it is and will schedule at the same time. Gil also spoke about an ordinance to protect small scale farmers. He would like to put this on the agenda for next week.

**HEARING OF CITIZENS:**

- Amanda LePage spoke about the Soccer, swimming and Tumbling sign ups are tomorrow night 5 – 7 in the Community Room. Soccer coaches on Wednesday at 5 pm.. A meeting was held for the 2020 Block Party. A lot of enthusiasm was shown. It is scheduled for August 8, 2020 at the ball field.
- Sonny discussed the side walk snow plow contracts. Dottie mentioned how a few years ago there was a discussion about combining the Main Street Contract and the Washington Street contract. Sonny stated that went out the window. Sonny said we are not going to put the other one out. Dottie stated that they should all go out to bid. Sonny said what we have run into in the last two contractors, three contractors we didn't get what we paid for. There was too much rather it was too cheap maybe the contract wasn't explicit enough or whatever it just didn't work out. Before that as far as Main Street was concerned we had just hired it done and so we went back to that and I think when it was all said and done we came out a little bit cheaper. When it was all said and done we got a better job. Joanne stated and no hassle. Sonny said and what happened all these arguments about you took the snow from the Post Office etc. We just went in and cleaned up the snow from the intersections. And when it was all said and done it was cheaper to do it that way. Down over the hill that has worked out to bid and was done very well. Joanne feels there is no need to change that contract. We should advertise and put it out to bid. Joanne feels the only change we should make on this contract is to change to start date from November 15<sup>th</sup> to November 1<sup>st</sup>. Joanne **motioned** that we put the sidewalk contract for Washington Street out for bid for three years beginning November 1, 2018 and ending May 1, 2021. Wendy **seconded** **.Passed** 4 – 0 Dottie did not vote.
- Steve McLean got up to speak about the Memorial Ride this past weekend and the Fire Dept. assisted in directing traffic. He mentioned that someone from the Board had a complaint about the lights.

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**ADJOURN MEETING:**

- A **motion** was made by Dottie to adjourn the meeting and go in to a Workshop. Wendy **seconded** the motion. The vote passed 5-0.
- **The Meeting was adjourned at 7:35 PM.**
