HISTORIAN'S CORNER
Neil Murray
The Irish Review - September /
November 1914

Pearse, Plunkett, and MacDonagh conjure up notions of rebellion. Lesser known about these leaders is their involvement with the Gaelic Revival. These military leaders were poets, writers, and artists. Their publication, The Irish Review, is full of literature and art that would inspire Irish Politics and the *Óglai gh na hÉireann itself*. I was recently

give three original copies of the Irish Review. These were gifted to me by an AOH brother down in Westchester, Andrew Scott. The amazing contents of these magazines sheds serious light on how they inspired the Irish to rebel. In the September / November 1914 edition the writers included "Twenty Plain Facts for Irishmen". Please find below, the twenty facts Pearse, Plunkett, MacDonagh, and others wanted you to know in 1914, two years before the Easter Rising.

- I. It is one thing to see the enemy's point of view; it is another thing to fight the enemy.
- II. The Irishman who says he would prefer to be under German rule than under English rule is a slave.
- III. The Irishman who says he would prefer to be under English rule than under German rule is a slave.
- IV. The Irishman who knows he should be under Irish rule and under no other is capable of attaining freedom.
- V. The Belgian owes no allegiance to Germany.
- VI. The Pole owes no allegiance to Russia, to Germany, or to Austria.
- VII. The Irishman owes no allegiance to England.
- VIII. The organization of the Irish Volunteers was begun on the 25th of November, 1913.
- IX. The British Government, on the 4th of December, 1913,

issued a Proclamation prohibiting the importation of arms into Ireland.

X. Under the Arms

Proclamation the British Government did what it could to hinder the Irish Volunteers from obtaining the arms necessary to equip them for the defense of Ireland.

XI. The Arms Proclamation was withdrawn in August, 1914, after the outbreak of an International European War.

XII. Every foreign country from which the Irish Volunteers could have procured arms is now in a state of war or of neutrality.

XIII. Ireland, having no arms factory of her own, is thus still hindered from obtaining arms for her defense.

XIV. The Irish Volunteers have been organized first to secure the rights and liberties of all the people of Ireland, and then to maintain those rights and liberties.

XV. The Irish Volunteers have not yet secured the rights and liberties of the Irish people.

XVI. The Irish Volunteers have no rights and liberties to defend.

XVII. The Irish Volunteers have not been enrolled to defend "England and her Empire," for the defense of which, according to the British proclamation, *Your King and Country Needs You*, the present war is being waged.

XVIII. No body, committee or person, has any right or liberty to use or to promise to use the efforts of the Irish Volunteers for any purpose other than the securing and the maintenance of the rights and liberties of the people of Ireland.

XIX. The Union Jack is the symbol of the Act of Union of 1800, by which the Irish Nation

was deprived of her last rights and liberties.

XX. The Irish Nation lives.

Cinnamon Roll-Ups

Time: 20 minutes
Yield: 8 servings
Ingredients:
1 (8-ounce) package crescent rolls
1/4 cup butter, softened
1/4 cup light brown sugar
2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
For the glaze:
1/2 cup powdered sugar
1 tablespoon milk
1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
Directions:
Step 1 -Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.
Step 2 -Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
Step 3 -Unroll the crescent triangles and place them onto the prepared baking sheet.
Step 4 -In a medium bowl, add the butter, the brown sugar, and the cinnamon and mix to combine.
Step 5 -Use a spoon to spread the cinnamon mixture over the top of the crescent rolls.
Step 6 -Roll up the crescent rolls and place them seam-side down on the prepared baking sheet.
Step 7 -Bake the roll-ups until they are lightly golden around the edges, about 9-12 minutes.
Step 8 -Allow the roll-ups to cool slightly.
Step 9 -In a small bowl, add the powdered sugar, the milk, and the vanilla and whisk to combine.

Step 10 -Drizzle the glaze over the roll-ups.

Step 11 -Serve warm



Easy Crab Cakes

Time: 30 minutes
Yield: 8 servings
Crab cakes are such a fun, seasonal dish for warmer weather months! With a crisp golden-brown crust around a tender, mildly sweet crab meat, these Easy Crab Cakes can be an amazing appetizer for your next gathering or with a side salad as the main course. Tangy and spicy, Easy Crab Cakes pack tons of bold flavors and can be made in 30 minutes or less. You can even say it's an ocean of flavor.

Ingredients

1/3 cup mayonnaise
1 large egg, beaten
2 tablespoons Dijon mustard
2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
1/2 teaspoon hot sauce
kosher salt, to taste
freshly ground black pepper, to taste
1 pound jumbo lump crabmeat, picked over for shells
3/4 cup panko bread crumbs
2 tablespoons parsley, freshly chopped
tap here
1/2 cup canola oil, for frying
lemon wedges, optional, for serving
cocktail or tartar sauce, optional, for serving

Directions

Step 1 -Combine the mayonnaise, egg, mustard, Worcestershire, and hot sauce in a small mixing bowl with a whisk.
Step 2 -Season with salt and pepper to taste.
Step 3 -Mix the crabmeat, panko, and parsley together in a medium-sized bowl.
Step 4 -Gently fold in the mayonnaise mixture and form into 8 crab cake patties.
Step 5 -Coat the bottom of a skillet with the oil and heat over medium-high on the stove-top.
Step 6 -Add the crab cake patties and cook in batches until golden brown and crisp on all sides, approximately 3-5 minutes on each side.
Step 7 -Serve warm with lemon, cocktail sauce, or tartar sauce.
