ASQ screens are sets of valid, reliable and age-appropriate questionnaires that are filled out by the true expert on your child, you!

BENEFITS OF SCREENINGS

Regular screening provides a fast and helpful look at how your child is doing in important areas like communication, social skills, motor skills, and problem solving. Screening can identify your child's strengths, uncover new milestones to celebrate, and reveal any areas where your child may need support. It helps you understand your child's development and know what to look for next. It helps you work with educators to plan next steps, when it makes the most difference in your child's critical

ASQ-3 DEVELOPMENTAL AREAS

Communication: language skills – what they understand and what they can say.

Gross Motor: how they use their arms, legs and other large muscles for sitting, moving and other activities.

Fine Motor: how they use their hand and finger movement and coordination.

Problem Solving: how they play with toys and solve problems.

Personal Social: their self-help skills and interactions with others

ASQ:SE-2 AREAS

Social-emotional development encompasses the behavioral areas of autonomy, compliance, adaptive functioning, self-regulation, affect, interaction with people and social-communication.
