John Snowdon has been actively involved with theatre for the past 45 years; as artistic director, adjudicator, director, actor, designer, and workshop instructor.

He is founding artistic director of THE THEATRE DOWNSTAIRS a production company based in Guelph; now in existence for 25 years.

He was also founding artistic director and manager of THEATRE ON THE GRAND, Fergus, for 5 years.

For 20 years John was artistic director of THEATRE IN THE TREES, a dinner theatre operating in the Arboretum at the University of Guelph. John's wife Margaret handled the managerial side of the dinner theatre, whilst John directed and designed the productions.

John has been absent from the adjudication circuit for a good number of years, due to the theatrical workload he carried, but in his "heyday" he has adjudicated 3 times as preliminary adjudicator for WODL, twice for QUANTA in Northern Ontario and once for Eastern Ontario Drama League.

In 1992 John was awarded the Commemorative Medal for his significant contribution to Canada, through his work in theatre.

### Festival Adjudicator - Virginia Reh

Virginia made her adjudicating debut in 1983, at the Theatre Ontario Festival in Sudbury. Since then she has adjudicated every region, Sears, one-act and in-house festivals, as well as consulting, directing and leading workshops around the province. She is particularly pleased to be returning to WODL, the region which has given her many happy memories of work and good times. Virginia appeared on stage in Theatre on the Grand's production of The Dining Room. Virginia's multi-faceted career embraces directing, acting, teaching, theatre, music theatre, opera, film, T.V. A former Artistic Director of the Gryphon Theatre, she has worked with the Shaw Festival, Canadian, Edmonton and Vancouver Opera Companies, Opera Lyra, Bayview

Playhouse, Tapestry Singers, and Theatre on the Grand, as well as teaching at the Banff Festival, Sheridan College, the Opera School (University of Toronto) and Theatre Ontario's Summer and Youth Courses.

This transplanted New Yorker (by way of California) has been a champion of Canadian theatre, was a founding Co-Director of ScriptLab, developing and workshopping scripts for film, theatre and music theatre. Directing credits include *The Merry Wives of Windsor, Ring, Round The Moon, Marat/Sade, Pirates of Penzance, Where's Charley?, The House of Bernarda Alba, A Flea in Her Ear, My Darling Judith, Camino Real, Eight to the Bar, The Foreigner, Le Cid, The New Moon and Kiss of the Spider Woman.* Dramaturgical work has included the adaptation of libretto and lyrics for Toronto Operetta Theatre's *Leo, the Royal Cadet.* Whether training singers at Banff or very young singers with the Canadian Children's Opera Chorus, workshopping musicals or scripts at the Lab, development and training have been a major focus of Virginia's career. In recent years, Virginia has directed voices for cartoon dubbing (*Sailor Moon*) and coached actors for on-camera work. She is a long-time member of the theatre faculty at Brock University and continues as dramatic adviser to Opera In Concert. Virginia is a past recipient of the Maggie Bassett Award for her outstanding contribution to theatre in Ontario.

"The adjudication process is not about awards, nor about turning art into a blood sport. It's about sharing ideas to see how we can make better theatre, for ourselves, for our audiences. For me it is both a teaching and a learning experience."



### Amadeus

The original play on which the Academy Award winning film was based, Amadeus is the story of Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart and Antonio Salieri, the composer for the Austrian court. Although Salieri privately admits to the genius of Mozart's music, consumed by envy, he conspires to make it difficult for Mozart to thrive within the court of Emperor Joseph II of Austria. As Salieri gets more involved in his vendetta to keep Mozart from establishing himself and his music, he begins to question why God has denied him the ability to create great music while granting that ability to Mozart, who he con-

siders unworthy of that gift. Salieri challenges God's right to deny him and grant Mozart what he thinks he deserves and vows to do whatever he can to block God on earth. Meanwhile Mozart continues to act in a way that antagonizes many of the influential people in Vienna, so that between Salieri's conspiring against him and his own actions, his life becomes more and more difficult, causing both his health and his welfare to deteriorate. Eventually Mozart dies in poverty, possibly with the complicity of, or maybe even at the hands of, Salieri.


