

In mid-2007 Mestek and Dadanco formed a joint venture to produce active chilled beams, induction diffusers and induction units for the North and South American markets. The products are produced in the USA in Mestek's manufacturing facility in Wyalusing, PA and Westfield, MA. Mr Harris holds the position of Vice President, Engineering with the Dadanco LLC joint venture and oversees all of the engineering, technical decisions and manufacturing partner relationship.

Summary of September Meeting

Roger Nasrallah, ing. of Enertrak spoke about variable refrigerant flow (VRF) systems and how refrigeration systems are now moving toward variable flow technologies. Mr Nasrallah explained that these systems are decentralized, and therefore are able to deliver comfort more accurately.

VRF systems consist of outdoor units and indoor units, which are both capable of modulating. The indoor unit coils are equipped with linear expansion valves (LEV), and modulate based on the superheat detected by electronic thermistors located on the condensing coil. The LEV also acts as a solenoid valve to stop refrigerant flow to dormant units. The outdoor unit compressor varies its speed based on the common saturated suction temperature. The flow of refrigerant in the compressor is directly proportional to the compressor speed, and the power input is directly proportional to the cube of the compressor speed. VRF systems modulate the supply air temperature while air flow remains constant.

Mr Nasrallah then discussed the different configurations of VRF systems, including 2 pipe cooling only, 2 pipe heating or cooling, 3 pipe simultaneous cooling and heating and combination with water and geothermal applications.

VRF systems can offer other benefits besides energy savings. One such benefit is better humidity control, as the coil is always cool and humidity is recirculated to the space. VRF system also do not require large mechanical rooms, and noise is reduced as the compressors are located in the outdoor unit.

ASHRAE New Faces of Engineering


