Together, these three remarkable individuals have dedicated over 120 years of combined service to our country. It was truly an honour to wrap each of them in a quilt — a symbol of comfort, gratitude, and appreciation for their selfless service.

These were just three of the nine quilts my team and I have presented across Manitoba this month alone. Each presentation is a meaningful moment — a chance to acknowledge our Veterans in a tangible and heartfelt way.

What is Quilts of Valour – Canada Society?

The Quilts of Valour – Canada Society is a national, volunteer-led organization whose mission is simple:

"To ensure that every Canadian Armed Forces member, past or present, who has been injured as a result of their service, is recognized and honoured with a comforting, handmade quilt"

To date, over 27,000 quilts have been presented across Canada — each one made by volunteers and donated to the cause. No two quilts are alike, and every one of them is stitched with respect, care, and love.



FOOD, HOUSING & GENTLY USED ITEMS

On September 23rd RG and Deb Hemlow headed out to Calgary to visit their son and daughter-in-law. During their visit they took a detour to the SE end of the city to visit ANAVETS #2 and present a \$2000.00 donation cheque to the Veterans Association. A friend and Veteran who RG served with at 14 Service Battalion in Calgary, George Carbert, or as he is fondly referred to as "Little George" (see picture) is part of this wonderful organization. Some of you may remember him as he attended the Dominion Convention in Winnipeg a few years ago.

George was very excited to be able to explain how their organization works and show us around the facilities which consisted of 4 donated warehouse bays where the food bank is located, office space where they conduct the Veteran Outreach Program and a separate Thrift Shop. The food bank area was very clean, stocked and organized. The 4 stacked boxes you see in one of the pictures is designed to feed a family of 4 for 1 month. They not only

provide non-perishable items, but also meat, bread, and fresh eggs and produce. They have a library/quiet room. They also have wheelchairs and walkers for those who require them. The Thrift Shop has clothes, shoes, furniture, kitchen ware and much, much more. It is open to the public and if you show your Veteran card you get 50% off. They have an 8-passanger van that was donated to them, and they use it to take Veterans to and from their medical appointments.

The Veterans Association recently took over Veteran Outreach responsibilities for Veterans in BC, AB, SK, and MB who require assistance in finding housing. As a matter of fact, they had just provided this assistance to one of our own CVMS member. They are now working on being able to have Medical Personnel right on the premises.

Men's Singles Snooker League – Monday evenings




More importantly, subscribing to the Play-pass generating tool has allowed us the opportunity to reflect back to our originating years.
