Biography – Dwight Scott

Dwight Scott has BScE (1964) and MScE (1968) degrees in Mechanical Engineering from UNB, as well as a BEd (1972). He retired from UNB in 2001, having spent 35 years at UNB and two years with ADI Limited. He was active with the American Society for Engineering, presenting a number of Effective Teaching Institutes in Canada and the USA.

While at UNB, Dwight was, at different times, Director of Undergraduate Studies in ME, Dean of Residence, Don of Bridges House, and Acting Associate Dean of Engineering. He has held various executive positions in the NB/PEI Chapter of ASHRAE and the Moncton Branch of the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of New Brunswick.

Many local ASHRAE members were once students of Dwight's. He has two sons, David, in Fredericton, and Darrell, in Calgary. He lives with his wife, Val Chongva, in Riverview.



Summary of November's Meeting

The meeting was chaired by Dan Boudreau, vice president. The large attendance of more than 25 was gratifying. Following introductions, a \$500 cheque was presented to Chris Stevens, for his son, Jonathan, who is a first year student in Pharmacy at Memorial University. Jonathan was awarded the scholarship this year, an award which is given annually to a son or daughter of a chapter member.

Jim Thomas, of Refrigeration Services, Inc., paid a return visit to our chapter, with an updated review of "Refrigerants: Current & Future Trends". Various refrigerants are collected and shipped to the Refrigeration Services facility in Dartmouth, NS, where they are analyzed using a gas chromatograph. This identifies the fractions which can be separated for reuse. Surplus refrigerants are collected in 30,000 pound tanks for shipping to disposal facilities in Alberta or Texas, where they are incinerated.

A significant date is January 1, 2010, after which no new R-22 equipment can be manufactured or imported. Although the older CFCs were most damaging to the ozone layer, another concern for most common refrigerants is their global warming potential (GWP). For example, HFCs have GWPs of between 1500 and 3900. Most new refrigerants are blends which are patented by their manufacturers.

A new hydrofluoroolefin (HFO) refrigerant, which has a proposed ASHRAE designation of R-1234YF, has a GWP of only 4. It is, however, flammable, and has a proposed ASHRAE safety designation of A2. Other hazardous refrigerants include ammonia (B2), hydrocarbons (propane, butane, isobutene) (A3), and CO_2 (A1). All of these, plus the new HFO refrigerant, need to be used in central refrigeration plants with a secondary chilled liquid loop. WalMart is opening a Superstore in Burlington, ON, using a CO₂ refrigeration system.

The meeting was a designated Refrigeration Night. Jim Thomas' updated Power Point presentation is posted on the chapter web site. There are several photographs of the handling and testing of refrigerants, and a number of useful tables near the end of the slides, showing the various replacement options for older refrigerants.
