## **Person of the Year**

## **WOOD**; Environmentally Friendly Building

Large scale commercial buildings that use increased amounts of timber decrease some of the environmental impacts of the building. This is according to a research project, "Environmental Impacts of Multi-Story Buildings, Using Different Construction Materials", conducted by the New Zealand Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry. The study modeled the life cycle energy use and carbon dioxide (CO2) equivalent emissions of four similar office building designs that used different materials as their main structural element; concrete, steel, timber and Timber Plus. The latter also used wood based non structural elements. Results indicated that of the four, the "Timber Plus" building had the lowest net environmental impact producing 4,571 tons of CO2 equivalent while the steel building had the highest or worst net impact using 6,789 tons of CO2 equivalent. Timber alone was second lowest at 5,454 followed by concrete at 6.627. ## VISITOR SAFETY



The specific requirements is the establishment of, and communicating the location of an Evacuation Point also often referred to as a "Muster Point" We have detailed the EVACUATION POINT at all three of our locations, please forward this information to your Safety Committee or to those personnel who may attend our workplace as a visitor.


\*Muster Points are indicated by the black Star.
