Metal Recycling

The Metal piles are being cleaned out and I want to give everyone a reminder to keep the following out of the metal pile:

- No Propane bottles of any kind (use designated area)
- No fencing, page wire etc (use the wire pile beside the metal piles)
- No wood
- No electric or battery appliances, tools, or lawn equipment in pile EXCEPT gas engines (lawn mowers, chainsaws, etc may be placed in metal pile. All electric/ Battery equipment can be placed in cages provided for the E-Pilot Project)

Oil Jugs and Pail Collection

A reminder that PRWM **does not accept** oil of any type at any of the three sites. The oil can be taken to Local retailers that collect the oil in town. PRWML does not have the proper equipment to store or handle the oil.

PRWM does accept the oil filters, empty oil jugs and empty 5 gallon pails with the **lids removed**. Oil filters go into the 45-gallon drum. The oil jugs and 5-gallon lids go into the black plastic bags on hangers inside the big chem shed on sites.
