Minutes of Oshawa Division No. 35 – Sons of Temperance, commencing Oct. 1st, 1883

Opening: The Division was opened in due form, with the W. P. in the chair.

Roll: On calling the roll of officers, the following were reported absent, viz. W. A., A. R. S. and P. W. P.

Minutes: The minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.

Proposals for membership: Mr. Fred A. Glenney and Mr. J. C. McCauley were proposed as fit and proper persons to become members of our Division.

Comm. app.: The usual comm. being appointed to investigate these propositions reported favorably and it was

Motion: moved by Bro. J. W. Ellis, seconded by J. Reid, that the report be received, the committee discharged and the candidates balloted for. Carried.

Balloting: On being balloted for, these candidates were declared accepted.

Initiated: Reb. W. P. Ferguson, B. A. and Mr. Reuben Hamlin were duly initiated into our order and signed our constitution.

Bill: A bill was read from Bro. Hall for light and attendance during the quarter and on the evening of the meeting held by Bro. McMurray, amounting to \$10.00.

Motion: Moved and seconded that the bill be received and that an order be drawn on the Treasury for the amount. Carried.

Proposal: Mr. Walter S. Pyper was also proposed as a fit person to become a member of our Division.

Committee: Bros. Manuel, Welch and Gibson, were appointed (to) a committee of investigation to report next Monday evening.

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Sons' Hall, Oshawa, Oct. 1st 1883, cont'd

Report of Committee: The Regalia Committee reported no progress. Sis Mrs. Hall thought it would be advisable for us to get a new set of emblems and Officers Regalia colored and one dozen new white ones.

Motion: Moved by Bro. Snider, seconded by Sis. Kirby, that we get the emblems and colored regalia for the officers.

Motion: Moved in amendment by Bro. J. W. Ellis, sec. by Sis Mrs. Hall, that the matter be laid over indefinitely. The amendment was Carried.

Report of Comm.: The Committee on Sunday afternoon meetings reported no progress.

Business: Bro. Hall read out the names of Jas. White, S. Keyes, R. H. Virtue, J. Lynn, J. Carnegie, A. Hobbs, W. G. Blackgrove, C. Clements, J. Bell and J. Simpson, as being behind in their dues.

Motion: Moved by Sis Mrs. Hall, seconded by Bro. Gibson, that these members be suspended until such a time as they come back and pay up their dues. Carried.

Suspension: These members were then declared suspended.

New Business: The R. S. reported the need of a new Minutes book.

Motion: Moved by Sis Mrs. Hall, seconded by Bro. Welch, that the R. S. be instructed to get a new Minutes book and bring the bill to the Division. Carried.

Request: Bro. Rev. J. A. Hainer requested a travelling card.

Motion: Moved and seconded that the Brother's request be granted. Carried.

Report of Room Committee: The Room Committee reported a chance of renting the lower part of the Hall to the School Board for school purposes for three or five years, and that they had made the Board an offer at \$50 per year and half the taxes.

Motion: Moved by Sis. J. Reid, seconded by Bro. J. W. Ellis, that the Division rent the lower part of the hall, if they agree to the terms offered.

Withdrawal motion: This motion was withdrawn.

Motion: Moved by Bro. Ferguson, seconded by Sis. Mrs. Hall, that the report of the Room Committee be accepted. <u>Carried</u>.

Motion: Moved by Bro. Welch, seconded by Bro. Y. E. Ellis, that the Gymnasium Club be requested to give up the occupation of the lower part of the hall. Carried.

Consultation: The Executive Committee of the Gymnasium Club held a consultation in the anteroom and concluded to give up the hall cheerfully at the wish of the Division.

Motion: Moved by Sis. Mrs. Hall, seconded by Sis. J. Reid that the matter be left in the hands of the Room Committee to do as they see fit regarding the letting of the Hall. <u>Carried</u>.

Resignation: Sister Bella Storie presented her resignation as she found it impossible to attend. The resignation was laid on the table.

Reading of Reports: The Y. S., Treas. and R. S. read their reports for the past quarter.

Motion: Moved and seconded that these reports be rec. and handed to the T. for examination. Carried.

Motion: Moved by Bro. Hall, seconded by Bro. Welch, that an order be drawn on the Treasury for \$5.40 for the per capita tax. Carried.

Motion: Moved and seconded in amendment that a different plan be adopted, viz. the programme Committee appointed a com. to choose sides of the members of the Division for the purpose of getting up programmes and to have marks, the side getting the least no. of marks at the end of the quarter to provide a supper for the whole division.

Declined: Sis Emily Reid declined to act on the programme Committee.

Motion: Moved & seconded in amendment to the amendment that this matter be laid over for one week and that during the time, the Prog. Com. be instructed to find out the best way of getting up programmes. The amendment to the amendment was <u>carried</u>.

Motion: Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Lost.

Withdrawal: This motion was afterwards withdrawn and the Room Com. was requested to investigate and report next Monday night.

Address: Bro. Hall thought that something ought to be done about getting members to take the paper about which Mr. Spence sent a circular.
