



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#### Welcome to the 2019 WODL Theatre Festival

#### **Honorary Festival Chair - ALEX MUSTAKAS**

The list is long – over 100 productions in 27 years, including the world premiere of *Marathon of Hope: The Musical* plus six original shows in the popular *Legends* series. Alex Mustakas launched the Drayton Festival Theatre in 1991 out of a tiny, virtually unused theatre in the crossroads community of Drayton. Now, Drayton Entertainment is one of Canada's largest not-for-profit theatre organizations operating seven venues across Western Ontario. For his impact on the arts in Canada, Alex is the recipient of the Ernst & Young Entrepreneur of the Year Award for Media & Entertainment, along with a national citation for outstanding community partnerships, the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal, the Maggie Bassett Award from Theatre Ontario, and the Governor General's Meritorious Service Medal. #### **Preliminary Adjudicator - TREVOR SMITH DIGGINS**



On February 19, after five months of driving around Western Ontario to do 23 adjudications, Trevor Smith Diggins announced his play selections for this festival and the award nominees and winners for the Out-of-Festival plays. Trevor Smith Diggins is a familiar face at WODL, having won the Best Actor award three times at past festivals. For two years he toured as adjudicator for the Association of Community Theatres / Central Ontario (ACT-CO) in both Comedy (2016) and Drama (2017) categories. A positive force in community theatre for 40 years, Trevor is an accredited adjudicator in the Theatre Ontario Talent Bank. In real life, Trevor specializes in communication strategy and media training for corporate and government clients across Canada – smithdiggins.com.

#### Festival Adjudicator - MAJA ARDAL

Playwright, Director, Actor and Theatre Trainer - Maja Ardal has been working in theatre for forty-eight years. Maja was the artistic director of Young People's Theatre in Toronto during the 1990s. Her production of *Whale* received the Dora award for outstanding production – one of many Doras she has received over the years. Maja wrote and performs in the hit shows *You Fancy Yourself* (Dora Award for performance) and *The Cure for Everything* (Dora nomination). Her play *The Hero of Hunter Street* was produced by 4 th Line Theatre in 2016, and she is writing two new plays for 4 th Line. Maja has adjudicated community theatre festivals across Ontario including QUONTA in 2015, London's One Act play Festival in 2016 and the 2018 Theatre Ontario Festival. Girls Like That is an explosive play starring seven young women that explores the evolution of feminist consciousness and modern female friendships in the wake of advancing technology. It examines mob mentality, sexual insecurity, double-standards, and the struggle to define oneself in a crowd.

The plot follows one class of girls, part of a prestigious school that takes only 20 students a year, guaranteeing they will remain in the same class from kindergarten to graduation. Jumping back and forth in time, the audience sees how societal pressures and expectations creep in and affect the dynamics of this group starting at their first meeting at five-years-old. As they near graduation, a naked photo of one of them gets sent around to the entire school and the other six girls explore what this means to their group and to themselves.

#### THE KAY McKIE TROPHY BEST PRODUCTION OUT OF FESTIVAL

This trophy is donated by Royal City Musical Productions Inc. to honour Kay McKie, one of the founders of RCMPI. Kay directed the Guelph Little Theatre production of *The Broken Jug* by Don Harron, which won a Best Production Award at both the WODL and DDF Festivals in 1967 – Centennial year. Kay received the Maggie Bassett Award from Theatre Ontario in 1999 "for a sustained and significant contribution to the development of theatre in Ontario." Kay is remembered as a prolific director, a perceptive adjudicator and a kind and encouraging mentor.




