
A social hour will begin at 5:00 PM with a cash bar, followed by the presentation at 6:00 PM, and dinner at 7:00 PM.

Subject: Innovation in Data Centre Ventilation

Bell, Marconi, Gates, Jobs, Zuckerberg and others have come to change the way our world communicates and have created an information technology (IT) industry which has served to grow our HVAC industry. However, today's data center designer challenge is to meet the growing cooling demand without increasing the energy footprint.

Luckily, in the past decade, we have seen a few key HVAC innovations (Oil less variable speed chillers/compressors, containerized cooling, ECM motors etc.) these innovations are necessary to keep data center designs in line with the booming IT growth.

Speaker Biography:

Native from Montreal, Marc Naccache graduated in Mechanical Engineering at the University of Sherbrooke in 1997 and made his first internship at Enertrak. Marc is a member of the Order of Engineers of Quebec and ASHRAE.

Amateur of innovative technology, he took a break from mechanical engineering to embark on an information technology journey. In 1998 he accepted a position at NORTEL, division of structured cabling, and became Manager of the IBDN copper and fiber line of products. He later became Manager of OEM custom products for the Pacific Rim and European markets.

Recognizing the evolution of wireless communications, he accepted a position in Dubaï, United Arab Emirates to develop the wireless market for large telcos in the MEA region. Then, to ensure the safety of these communication networks, he became Director at Symantec, the leader in Internet security, and managed through the incumbent state run telcos to provide Internet security available to all subscribers in the country.

After several years abroad, Marc, educated in the computer industry and a little nostalgic for Canada, accepted the position of Director of Emerging Markets at Hewlett-Packard where he specialized in IT servers and storage for rendering farm in the video game industry who settled in large numbers in Quebec and are constantly demanding more power, thereby, higher capacity precision cooling.

In May 2009, Marc became Business Development Manager in the company responsible for his initial training, Enertrak, where he specializes in the development of precision air conditioning for computer rooms.













Lobster Kitchen Party, June 22, 2013


















2013 Golf Tournament
