Public Involvement Meeting for WIS 35 improvement project in Pierce County

Meeting will provide project information and encourage community feedback.

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) Northwest Region will hold a public involvement meeting to discuss improvements to WIS 35 from US Highway 63 to Coulee Creek near Diamond Bluff, Pierce County. The meeting is scheduled from 6 to 7 p.m. on **Thursday, February 8, 2018** at the Town of Diamond Bluff Hall located at W9870 290th Avenue, Hager City, Wisconsin 54014.

The meeting will be an informal open house. Exhibits showing the plan concepts will be on display. Project representatives will be available to discuss the project on an individual basis.

This project includes resurfacing the pavement of WIS 35, beam guard replacement, culvert rehabilitation, replacing signs, rumble strips, and pavement marking. This project is expected to take place during the 2019 construction season. This project will be constructed under traffic utilizing single lane closures and flagging operations.

The public is encouraged to attend the meeting, provide input and ask questions concerning the project. WisDOT representatives will be available to discuss the project and answer questions.
