



81ST PROVINCIAL WINTER FAIR

2019 SHEEP PIONEER EVENT – REGULATIONS



1. The Provincial Winter Fair Committee and the Kamloops Exhibition Association will be NOT be responsible for any accidents connected with this contest.
2. This event will be held on the Saturday evening during the Provincial Winter Fair.
3. Club members who have won a lamb in this 4-H event previously are not eligible.
4. Qualifications for contestants are:
 - a) Age limits - 11 by January 1st and not reaching 20 by December 31st of the current year.
 - b) Be a member of a 4-H Club competing at the current year's Provincial Winter Fair.
 - c) Be a 4-H member interested in the feeding and caring of the lamb.
 - d) Be able to feed and care for a lamb and have the necessary facilities and feed for proper care, Feeding, and training of lamb.
 - e) Must comply with all terms as stated in the "Entry Form" and must provide the Provincial Winter Fair Committee with the Minor's Release form, duly signed and witnessed as required on the form.
 - f) Must have completed a full year in club work previous to this current year.
 - g) Must be a member of a 4-H Lamb Club this year.
 - h) Must be a member of a regularly organized 4-H Lamb Club, competing at the Provincial Winter Fair the following year.
 - i) The Lamb will be eligible for the "Sheep Pioneer Event" and MUST be used as the 4-H Member's market project and subject to regular husbandry checks by the member's club leader and/or the PWF Committee.
 - j) The lamb is subject to all PWF General and 4-H/Open Sheep Rules and Regulations
 - k) The donated lamb shall be picked up by the 4-H member by May 31st. Failure to do so will result in the 4-H member forfeiting their right to the lamb and it will become the property of the Provincial Winter Fair Sheep Pioneer Event Committee.
5. Failure to comply with any of the above prescribed regulations will result in forfeiture of the lamb; its return and ownership will revert fully to the Provincial Winter Fair Sheep Pioneer Event Committee.

6. Signed “Entry Forms” and “Minor Release Form” must be completed and returned to Provincial Winter Fair Committee prior to June 15. No application will be considered that is not properly completed.
7. If the lamb has a problem and has to be sold, or dies, and the Provincial Winter Fair Sheep Pioneer Event Committee wishes to replace said lamb, the lamb must be replaced before July 1st to still be eligible for the Sheep Pioneer Event.
8. Monies from the sale or insurance must be forwarded to the Provincial Winter Fair Sheep Pioneer Event Committee, to aid in replacement of said lamb. If the lamb dies after July 1st, it is no longer eligible for replacement for this event at Provincial Winter Fair.
9. The Provincial Winter Fair Event Committee reserves the right, without prior notification, to set up separate classes and to make any other change in regulations that, from time to time, are deemed necessary by the PWF Sheep Event Committee.
10. **\$15** Non-refundable entry fee made out to the Provincial Winter Fair Pioneer Event Fund must accompany each entry.
11. ***BE ADVISED:*** *As part of the competition, a proper working rope halter is required to be constructed. The committee chairs advise **all** entrants to learn how to make a rope halter prior to the event on the Saturday evening of the fair, in order to assist them with their success in the competition.*
12. **SHOULD A MEMBER ENTERED IN THE TWEMLOW EVENT NOT BE SUCCESSFUL IN WINNING A PROJECT, THE MINIMUM RETAINED PREMIUM OF \$15 WILL GO TOWARDS THAT MEMBER’S ENTRY INTO THE SHEEP PIONEER EVENT THE FOLLOWING YEAR. Entry forms to be completed annually.**
