The first step in healing is always the hardest. This program may give you hope or at the very least some peace of mind.



The Unveiling and Dedication of the Dufferin Street Gang Monument Selkirk, Manitoba

Thirty-one young men and women from Dufferin Street, Selkirk, volunteered to serve in the armed forces of Canada during World War Two. Their service and self-sacrifice were not forgotten by their community. In recent years their families and friends decided commemorate their accomplishments erecting a suitable monument. The Royal Canadian Legion Selkirk Branch number 42 participated in the project and the monument was erected on the grounds of the Legion branch on Eveline Street, Selkirk. The service of unveiling and dedication took place on Sunday, 18 September, a warm autumnal day.

The parade assembled at the corner of Jemima and Dufferin and marched to the site of the monument. The skirl of pipes accompanied the parade. The parade was led by the Legion Colour Party under the command of the Sergeant at Arms, Brian Wilson. Then came the Clandeboye Pipes and Drums under the direction of Piper Denis Schindler. A large gathering of family, friends and various VIPs followed and they came to the site of the monument. After the singing of 'O Canada', the President of the Legion, John Austin, welcomed the people to the service. Wayne Bird, a nephew of John 'Jack' Vernon Sinclair, one of the Dufferin Gang, was Master of Ceremonies and the Padre of the Legion, Fr Stephen Sharman, conducted the service of dedication. Mrs. Jean Gunter, widow of Gerald L Gunter, a member of the Dufferin Gang, unveiled the monument. Wreathes were placed on the monument by James Bezan, MP, Dr Alan Lagimodiere, MLA, Larry Johannson, Mayor of Selkirk and Jack Park, representative Manitoba of the Metis Federation who supported the project with a generous donation. Randy Robins, a bugler, played the Last Post and the Reveille and the piper, Denis Schindler, played the Lament. The service concluded with a Benediction and the singing of 'God save the King'.

After the service, a reception was held in the Legion Branch which became a time for old friends to gather and old war stories to be told again. The members of the Dufferin Gang served in many of the area of combat during the War. Let one example serve for all. Harold Little served with the Fort Garry Horse at D-Day where he was wounded. He survived the war and returned home to Selkirk. He and his comrades will never be forgotten. Their monument will remind all who pass by that they served and died for us.

Brandur Goodbrandson, Siggi Goodbrandson, Charles Anthony Griffiths, Walter Daniel 'Dan' Griffiths, Beatrice Gunter, Blair Gunter, Elma Gunter, Gerald L Gunter, John 'Jack' Gunter, Harold R Henrikson, Paul Hendrikson, Richard 'Dick' Johnstone, John 'Jack' C Laye, James 'Jim' Laye, Harold F Little, Bill (W D) Little, Jack Norquay, Tom Norquay, Harry Scramstad, Bob Ingwald R Scramstad, Otto Scramstad, Allan Sinclair. John 'Jack' Vernon Sinclair, Harold Starr, Stefan Stefanson, Charles W Tetroe and Frank Tetroe.

The monument has two benches next to it where people may sit, think and remember. We remember the loyalty and self-sacrifice of those who volunteered to serve their sovereign and country in times of war. May their memory be eternal.

Digital Membership Card Now Available

The Dominion Command Membership Committee is pleased to announce the launch of the Digital Membership Card! A Member can now choose a traditional plastic card or a Digital Card.

The Digital Card meets the needs of Members who prefer the option to store and carry their card on their mobile device. Additionally, the Digital Card offers considerable administration savings for the Legion.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW... There are now two card options

- The traditional plastic card is not being discontinued.
- All Members now have a choice of a traditional plastic card <u>or</u> a Digital Card.... unfortunately, not both.

Cost savings

- Digital Membership cards are free!
 There is no cost to Members or Branches.
- Digital cards save administrative costs in production, replacement and delivery to Branches and Members.

Member technical requirements

- 1. A Member must have:
 - an email address on their Membership profile (how the card is delivered)
 - 2. an IOS (Apple) or Android mobile device to receive a digital card (where the card is stored)
- On IOS devices, the card is stored in Apple Wallet. On Android devices, the card is stored in Google Pay.

Delivery

- Digital cards are delivered directly to the Member by email to download to their mobile device. They are not delivered to the local Branch.
- Digital cards are delivered within minutes of being requested. Unlike the traditional plastic card, there is no 4–6week delivery timeframe.

How can a Member request a Digital Card?

- 1. Active Members can select a Digital Card through their Member profiles within the Member Services Website.
- 2. Renewing Members can request a Digital Card during their online renewal process.
- New Members joining online will default to receiving a Digital Card during the enrollment process. They can also opt for a traditional plastic card during the process.
- 4. Members can contact Dominion Membership directly to request the Digital Card.

How can a Branch request a Digital Card?

- Branches can request a Digital Card for a Member via the Member's profiles within the Member Services Website under Additional Information.
- 2. Branches can request Digital Cards via the Data Change Form within the Member Services Website.

Card renewal and prepaid Membership years

- If a Member has opted for a Digital Card, then upon renewal they will be sent a new Digital Card via email with the updated renewal year to download to their mobile device.
- If a Member has selected a Digital Card and pre-pays for multiple years, their Digital Card will display the maximum membership year paid.

Branch notification of card selection

 The Processing Transmittal Form, the individual Member profile, and the Branch Membership Register will all indicate if the Member has opted in for a Digital Card.

The Digital Card is the next step in the evolution of modernizing the membership experience and was designed to expedite the membership process for joining and renewing online while offering a highly efficient, cost-effective alternative to our traditional plastic card.
