

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The Candle of Hope

Reader 1: In a world of war, famine, and civil unrest, where children grow up as orphans and are used as fighters; where families go hungry and entire regions face destruction by illness, God, we call upon you to come and heal this broken world and help us to recognize that we need to be doing our best for our neighbours because - "It's about the world".

Reader 2: In a world where so many have lost hope, we call upon you, Lord of Hope, to come and heal this broken world. Set our hearts on fire with the skills, knowledge and wisdom to do together, what we can, to bring hope to others. Help us to use the spiritual gifts you have given each one of us.

Reader 1: In this season of Advent, we wait for the coming of Hope into our world. We await the birth of the Christ-child, the coming of God into our lives in a new way. Help us to live less for ourselves and more for others because - "It's about the world".

Reader 2: Come, Messiah, Come, and Save Us and heal this broken world with the hope you kindle in us to do your will. You are the potter and we are the clay, we ask that you shape us and mold us into your image and send us forth as witnesses of your hope for the world.

Prayer: Dear God, we pray for the Hope that is in Christ Jesus to shine in our lives in a new way this Advent. Help us to live out that hope as we strive to help those in this world who struggle each day. May they see Christ's light shining forth from us showing that "it's about the world". Amen.
