We await final details, but there is a community granny square blanket program that will run through the PG Library from November through December 14th. Community members will be invited to create granny squares, which will be joined together into a blanket and then donated to The Prince George Palliative Care Society. ### LEARNING SESSION

Felted Mittens with Shelley K! New Date: Sunday, October 27. Pre-registration is required for this event.

These mittens are cut from 100% wool duffle cloth, decorated using needle felting techniques, then sewn together in a special way. Very warm. With winter, and Christmas, on its way, these are great as gifts or for yourself. The duffle, fibre for needle felting, some tapestry yarn to sewing pieces together, thread, and the copy written pattern booklet which contains several patterns will



all be supplied. If you have needles for felting, bring them. If not they can be purchased for \$5.25 for a set of three. Colours of duffle available include natural, blue, black, purple, aqua.

If you have taken this before, and still have the copy written pattern booklet, you can come for a refresher at a reduced cost. Bring your pattern booklet.
