PEER SUPPORT WORKER

1 Part-Time Contract Position (Female Preference)

The Mental Health Rights Coalition is looking to hire one part-time Peer Support Worker for Women Support. This Peer Support Worker position is seconded from and supported by the Mental Health Rights Coalition (MHRC) and will work under the direction and supervision of the Canadian Mental Health Association (CMHA), Hamilton Branch. The position is based at CMHA Hamilton. This part-time fixed contract is 2 days per week (Mondays and Fridays, 9:00 am to 4:00 pm) until March 31, 2021, starting immediately with the possibility of extension dependent on funding.

As part of an inter-professional team, the Peer Support Worker will enhance services provided to clients at CMHA Hamilton. The Peer Support Worker will act as a role model in self-care and recovery, and engage with people experiencing serious mental illness and substance use disorder. They will help peer reintegrate into community from hospital and from custody, and advocate for access to required resources. The Peer Support Worker will support peers one-to-one in the community and facilitate recovery-based groups.

Successful candidates will possess knowledge, experience and skills related to the following:

- Personal, lived experience of serious mental illness and/or substance use disorder
- Involvement/understanding of the criminal justice system
- Knowledge of recovery principles
- Shared commitment to CMHA Hamilton's Mission Statement and Values
- Shared commitment to MHRC's Mission Statement
- Successful completion of Peer Support Training Program at MHRC or equivalent Ontario Peer Development Initiative (OPDI) including the completion of practicum
- Experience providing peer support
- Knowledge of community resources
- Able to work as part of a team
- Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST), safeTALK, and Mental Health First Aid Training are considered assets
- French-speaking is an asset
- Valid driver's license and access to a vehicle with \$1 million liability insurance is an asset
