BRITISH COLUMBIA SPECIFIC REGULATIONS FOR CLOVERBUD PROJECT



1. The 4-H Cloverbud project is a 4-H discovery project of available 4-H projects in British Columbia.

Unit 1:

- Cloverbuds explore Outdoor Living, Beef, Honeybee, Horticulture, Safety At Home, Poultry and Sheep.
- Members are required to complete the 4-H Cloverbud Scrapbook for Achievement Day.
- Unit work is designed for ages 6, 7 & 8.

Unit 2:

- Cloverbuds explore Rabbit, Foods, Small Engines, Safety on the Farm, Llama, Crafts and Dairy.
- Members are required to complete the 4-H Cloverbud Scrapbook for Achievement Day.
- Unit work is designed for ages 6, 7 & 8.

Unit 3:

- Cloverbuds explore Swine, Clothing, Horse, Bicycle Safety, Goat, Dog and Photography.
- Members are required to complete the 4-H Cloverbud Scrapbook for Achievement Day.
- Unit work is designed for ages 6, 7 & 8.
- 2. Cloverbud members are boys and girls who have reached their 6th birthday, by midnight December 31 of the year prior to achievement, and who have not reached their 9th birthday by midnight December 31 of the year prior to achievement.
- 3. Cloverbud members are only eligible to be enrolled within the Cloverbud project. Children ages 6, 7 & 8 are not eligible to be enrolled in other BC 4-H projects.
- 4. Cloverbud members may only be enrolled in one Cloverbud unit per year.
- 5. Cloverbud members are not eligible for Junior 4-H communication badges, e.g. public speaking. The Cloverbud project is a discovery project, which emphasizes group creativity and participation, not competition.
- 6. The minimum project duration is six months.
- 7. All scrapbooks must be the results of the member's own work and/or the joint efforts of Cloverbud group participation.
- 8. Recommendation that 4-H clubs offering the Cloverbud project focuses on one unit per year. (e.g. all Cloverbud age members work on Unit 2)
- 9. Upon achievement, the Cloverbud member is eligible for a 4-H Achievement Certificate and the specific Cloverbud Unit Badge.
- 10. 4-H Cloverbud leaders should work with District 4-H Council for inclusion of Cloverbuds in Cloverbud level classes at district rallies. Cloverbud leaders should work with 4-H Events in establishing 4-H Cloverbud display classes.
- 11. Each 4-H family should in addition to this publication have 4-H Publication #150, "BRITISH COLUMBIA GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR 4-H CLUBS".
