

THE VENERABLE G. H. SADLER, B.A., L.S.T. Archdeacon of Lanark


Born October 31, 1898, on the 10th Line of Fitzroy. Educated in Fitzroy Harbour and Arnprior. Ordained priest, St. George's, Fitzroy, June 17, 1924. Rector of Smiths Falls, since 1945. Archdeacon of Lanark, 1962.


FITZROY HARBOUR was settled in 1818 by the Shirreff family who came from Port Hope. In 1832 Mr. Charles Shirreff erected at the "Chats" a square, hewed log building for the purpose of a school house and for the holding of religious services. It was both the first church and the first school house in Fitzroy.

The building was common property for all religious denominations and was for years the only place in the township where regular public worship was held, though ministers from Protestant churches did visit and preach in homes. The Methodists were first, represented by Rev. Mr. Playfair of Perth. The first Presbyterian minister was Dr. Alexander Mann of Pakenham, and the first Anglican services in Fitzroy were conducted occasionally, prior to 1826 by Rev. Michael Harris of Perth. He served ten preaching stations outside of Perth and visited settlers as far east as Pakenham and Fitzroy. Rev. Hannibal Mulkins was the first minister to hold services with any degree of regularity.

The church society of the diocese of Toronto was established April 28, 1842 and by 1851 it consisted of twelve districts,

one of which was Bathurst deanery. It in turn included Perth, Carleton Place, Franktown, Pakenham and Fitzroy, Bytown, Richmond township and March. In 1850 the total income from Bathurst deanery was £51, indicating the struggle and sacrifice that the building of a church entailed in those rigorous days.

In 1852 the deed of the church property was obtained from Alexander Shirreff and the synod journal for 1854 reported that "due to the energetic efforts of the church warden W. P. Taylor and his committee they expected a building at Fitzroy would

soon be started".

Apparently a church was planned and actually started as early as 1857 since the synod journal for that date reports that "£1000 would be required to complete the church at Fitzroy Harbour. It was felt that this sum was beyond the means and circumstances of the mission at that time. A previous estimate of £400 had been made by an architect, a quarter of which had been raised by the mission and all of which had been spent." The total offering in 1857 was £12/14s/5d. According to the synod journal the same state existed in 1859. We are told that the walls were erected sever 'vears before a roof was added; during which time the sheep were lered in and out at will.

Finally in 1863 the church was completed, and it still belonged to the mission of Pakenham and Fitzroy which covered 200 square miles and had 1600 church members, 300 communicants and three churches. There were 125 public baptisms of cants and three churches. There were 125 public baptisms of infants and ten marriages that year. The rector was Rev. C. P. Emery and Rev. John Travers Lewis was bishop. The delegates to the synod were W. P. Taylor, J. Baird and J. Shaw; the latter representing Pakenham. The first child baptized in the new church was Minerya Landon, mother or the Venerable Archdeacon C. H. I. Sedler The first marriage was that of John Craig and G. H. L. Sadler, The first marriage was that of John Craig and Margaret Bradley; while the first death recorded in 1863 was Samuel Amm, an infant. The church was dedicated in 1867.

Several houses served as rectories over the years till 1952 when the present spacious, attractive building was erected. Recently the interior of the church was renovated and redecorated. A new oil furnace and new electric wiring was installed, the floor tiled and new carpet laid, the kneelers padded and a new dossal curtain hung. The result is an atmosphere of beauty and dignity truly befitting God's house.
