


As summer winds down, we successful season of cribbage.

#### Welcome back, Brothers and Sisters!

We trust you had a safe and relaxing summer! Our summer involved relaxing activities, such as motorcycle riding, spending time at the cottage, camping, and continuing to do what we love, supporting veterans and veteran causes!

To that end, CVMS members participated in a fund-raiser for the Red Rose Ranch Veteran Horse Camp (R3VHC) and did our part by presenting the organizers with a \$2,000.00 cheque for their upcoming horse camps this fall! Red Rose Ranch Veterans Horse Camp delivers horsemanship training and ranch life experiences to Military, First Responders, and veterans who strive for improvement; physically, mentally, and spiritually.

CVMS members also took a donation to the local RCMP office in Headingley and presented them with a \$2,000.00 cheque for their Slain Members Fund, so that members of D Division can travel to honour their fallen comrades when the need arises.

CVMS members also participated in this years Highway of Heroes Ride, an event coordinated by the Manitoba UN/NATO veterans' group, and while at the Artillery Museum in Shilo, presented a representative from the Shilo MFRC with a \$2,000.00 cheque for their "Hold Me Tight" couples program. This program helps military and veteran couples learn how to cope with the stress of being a military family, and how to reconnect with your partner.

Riders from CVMS also participated in this years Rolling Barrage, an event various members of our group have participated in since it's inception! This coast-to-coast ride features some participants riding the entire way from Newfoundland to British Columbia, and others able to join local legs as the ride moves thru their locale. The ride aims to raise PTSD awareness, and their mantra is "it is not a disorder or a disease, it is an injury sustained from the traumas of one's duty to protect Canada and her citizens."

We also have additional donations yet to be made. We will be donating to Forging Ahead, which "Is dedicated to helping veterans and first responders with operational stress injuries manage and cope with their emotions through the use of artistic blacksmithing and metalworking.", and we will also be donating to Sleep in Heavenly Peace, an organization whose motto is "No kid sleeps on the floor in our town!"





# Winnipeg's 150 Celebration



Commissioned at Port Arthur on 29 Jul 1943, she arrived at Halifax in mid-Sep 1943 and, after working up at Pictou, was assigned to EG W-7 of Western Escort Force. In Dec 1943 she was transferred to W-6, acting as Senior Officer's ship from Feb to Apr 1944. Winnipeg then joined W-5, again as S.O., and served with that group until it was disbanded in Jun 1945. In Aug 1945 she was placed in reserve at Sydney, but was re-activated for passage to Esquimalt, where she arrived on 21 Dec 1945. She was paid off into reserve there on 11 Jan 1946, but in 1956 she was brought around to the east coast and, on 07 Aug 1959, handed over to the Belgian Navy as A.F. Dufour. She was broken up in 1966. Its not confirmed but the superstructure of Winnipeg may still be in use as a firefighting-training platform in Zeebrugge.


