Any profit which may be realized is put back into the society for the benefit of the organization and its members. SLDCS is owned by the collective membership who elect a Board of Directors to represent them in leading the work of the Society. The Board of Directors hires and supervises the Artistic Director to administer the studio. While the Board of Directors is responsible for the governance of the Society, the Artistic Director is responsible for operations. SLDCS parents and guardians are required to volunteer their time and expertise through the work of operational committees. The Artistic Director, Staff and Board of Directors work together to address concerns and to nurture innovation and accountability in the programs of the Slave Lake Dance Creations.

Tuition & Payment Policies.

- 1. \$40 registration fee per dancer (to a max of \$80 per family) is due at time of registration to secure your dancer's placement in class.
- 2. Tiny Dancer and single (45 minute) classes are payable in 2 payments; September & December 1st.
- 3. Full Season Program Tuition Fees is calculated on at least 33 weeks of classes, and divided evenly over 9 months (Sept-May).
- 4. EMT payments sent to treasurer@dancecreations.ca
- 5. Monthly tuition is due on the 15th of every month using EMT, or post dated cheques, for the remaining 8 months tuition installments (Oct to May). If paying by cash arrangements need to be made through the Registrations Director.
- 6. Late fees of \$10 will be applied to each month's past due fees after the 15th day of the month.
- 7. The option of paying tuition in full is available. You will receive a 10% discount on tuition only. To qualify one must pay full tuition and all costume deposits and festival fees, by September 30th. Contact the registration director if you are interested in this option.
- 8. There will be a \$25 recital fee per family.

Cancellations:

- 1. Registration fee is non-refundable.
- 2. Class cancellation is accepted by providing 30 days written notice for the first of the following month, and refunds on pre-payments will only be issued on un-used classes.
- 3. Class transfer cut-off is October 1st. No new registrations after October 1st.
- 4. No refunds will be issued from dance fees for any missed regular dance classes or any unattended make-up classes.
- 5. No refunds will be issued from dance fees for days with months of Statutory Holidays.

Costumes & Festival Fees:

- 1. Costume deposit of \$120 per costume is DUE October 15th and are non-refundable. This applies to all groups, solos, duets and trios. Note: Costume credits will be applied to your account if applicable.
- 2. Festival registrations of \$45 for groups per festival, per routine and \$60 for solos. These are DUE November 30th and are non-refundable.
- 3. Costume charge adjustments +/- (if any) will be due when costumes arrive. Differences in budget costume costs are relating to conversion rates, and delivery/duties.
- 4. Costume and festival fees will be posted to your account at the beginning of the year.

Costuming

All dancers enrolled in the full season dance program will be required to purchase a costume for each class that includes choreography. All classes have a choreography routine to perform.

We attempt to keep our costuming as economical as possible, however the average price of each costume can vary depending on the currency conversion rate and delivery costs to Canada. Costumes are special order; therefore cannot be returned or refunded.

Please note: costumes are ordered based on a general measurement chart. Therefore, it is possible that minor alterations may be required for your dancer's costume(s) at the responsibility of the parent.

*Costumes deposits are DUE October 15th and are required before a costume is ordered.

<u>Costume Requirements</u> – A list of information referred to as "Costume Requirements" will be provided via email and posted on the notice board for each class costume. The sheet will have the Instructors Name, Class, Discipline, Class Day and Time, Name of the Class Dance (as listed in the recital program), general performance dates, a description of the costume, as well as detailed information regarding the tights, shoes, hair, makeup and accessory requirements for each dancer.

<u>Dance & Costume Accessories -</u> Dance tights, and all other requirements will be needed for dress rehearsal & performances.

Festival Information

Festivals provide dancers the opportunity to perform their class dance on stage in front of an audience, and have an adjudicator (judge) assess their performance. All participants of festivals will receive a medal for each performance based on the adjudicator's assessment. The festivals take place in the spring and each class will perform once at each of the festivals. This may take place during the school/workday, and an estimated 2 to 3 hours will be required at the venue for each performance. You may notice that the leveling for festivals may differ at different festivals. The leveling is determined by the specific rules set out by each individual festival.

*The cost for festival registration deposits are DUE by November 30th.

Festivals for Performance Level & Combo Classes:

All performance level dancers and combo classes (excluding Acro) participate in one festival.

Festivals for Competitive Level:

All competitive level classes attend all festivals - with the exception of MINI (who will attend 2 OR 3).

Fundraising & Family Commitment Policies

Fundraising Cheque:

Fundraising will be an important tool to continue the financial stability of our studio and will continue to provide many benefits to our dancers and their families. Fundraisers and activities are an excellent way to become an active member of the Society and your child's studio. To help encourage families to do so we have implemented a Fundraising Policy which includes each family to provide the Society with a fundraising cheque. Fundraising not your thing? Just let the Society know and your fundraising cheque can be deposited. This is done to make it fair to the families that do participate in our fundraisers, as all dancers at the studio benefit from many of the events and items the Society works to provide. All families are encouraged to participate in the fundraisers to ensure the group is successful. Each family is required to provide a post dated cheque for \$400 if you attend one festival. (This does not apply to any dancer whose group will not be attending a festival – Tiny Dancer) In order for your cheque to be returned at the end of the season, each family will be required to participate in 4 fundraisers. The fundraisers for the season will be shared in an email to all parents as they become available. Going forward we'd prefer to only accept EMT for fundraisers. EMT's for fundraisers must be sent to fundraising@dancecreations.ca

Family Commitment Cheque:

We can also continue to reduce the studios costs if our parents are willing to volunteer time. The Society has also implemented a Family Commitment Policy. By donating your time to the studio, we can also further reduce costs. Each family is required to provide a post dated cheque for \$250 if you attend one festival, so again this does not apply to Tiny Dancers. In order for your cheque to be returned at the end of the season families must donate 3 (three) hours of their time to the studio for Competitive level dance families and 1.5 (one and a half) hours for Performance level families. A detailed list and opportunities will be provided by email throughout the year.

- Please post date cheques to May 15, 2025 and drop off at the studio the first day of dance, include your dancers names in the memo.
- If paid by cash or e-transfer, a refund will be issued once commitments are met.
- Please make cheques out to SLDCS
- DANCERS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE UNTIL CHEQUES ARE RECEIVED.

Student's Code

<u>Attendance and Punctuality</u> – All students are expected to attend classes regularly and on time, in consideration of the teacher and the other students. If a dancer is continually late, or absent, with no prior notification, they may be removed from competition dances - this is particularly enforced in the Competitive Program.

<u>Conduct</u> – We ask that all students and guests respect the studio and dancers by; using the boot racks provided/ placing shoes neatly in the entrance area, remaining quiet, & refraining from running or throwing items in the lobby. Dancers eating in these areas are expected to clean up after themselves. Water bottles are acceptable in the studios. Cell phones must be turned off while dancers are in class. <u>Attire</u> – We ask that all dancers show up ready for dance wearing the proper attire and hair done as per the specifications for the class. Have your dance bag with you with all the essentials you need for class. Such as your water bottle, extra hair ties and bobby pins. Wear the correct footwear needed for your lesson.

Parent's Code

<u>Attendance and Punctuality</u> – Please use Jackrabbit to notify the studio instructor if any dancer will be missing.

<u>Conduct</u> – Every child is entitled to dance and is to be treated with kindness and respect. We expect that only positive comments and actions will be relayed between parents as well as towards ALL of our dancers. Questions and concerns should be addressed to the Artistic Director.

<u>Parking</u> – Please park respectfully to ensure all available 10 spaces may be used by studio parents. Parking spots to the rear of the building are reserved (from fence to garage). Additional space is available along 3rd street, and street parking in front of Pioneer drop in Centre. If your dancer is too young to locate your vehicle in the parking lot please come inside the studio to meet them. Please don't park in front of the fire hydrant.

<u>Performances-</u> Dance performances are a team effort and it is important to attend all performances. The studio and instructors provide lots of information on events such as dress rehearsals, festivals, recital, and photos.

<u>Staying Informed</u> – Remaining aware of what is happening within your child's program is extremely important. We at Dance Creations attempt to do everything possible to ensure that all parents and dancers are well informed. Email is our preferred method of communication. We also request that you ensure you are receiving studio emails (sent at least monthly), facebook page, and website at www.dancecreations.ca on a regular basis to stay informed.

Dress Code

Hair should always be slicked back. Ballet buns for all ballet classes, head band for short hair. Jazz can be a ponytail or a bun. Acro braids or low ponytail.

Attire- Black bodysuit, beige tights (Mondor *capri tights in light tan) Optional dance shorts, or leggings.

Shoes-Beige "Tan" Tap shoes

Attire- Black bodysuit, beige tights (Mondor *capri tights in light tan) Optional dance shorts, or leggings.

HIP HOP

Shoes-Indoor runners (MUST be clean)

Attire- Something dancers feel comfortable moving and sweating in - no jeans.

Jazz

Shoes- Beige "Elasta-bootie" Bloche brand (no laces)

Attire- Black bodysuit, beige tights (Mondor convertible tights in light tan) Optional dance shorts, leggings, or yoga style pants.

Hair- slicked back ponytail, or hair band for short hair.

Lyrical/Contemporary

Shoes- = jazz shoes dancers already have. Contemporary will be bare feet.

Attire- Black bodysuit, beige tights (Mondor *capri tights in light tan) Optional dance shorts, leggings. Hair- slicked back ponytail, or hair band for short hair.

Jazz/Lyrical/Contemporary/Modern/Musical Theatre CHOREOGRAPHY classes

Attire- dancers MUST be in all black for easy cleaning.

HIP HOP

Shoes- Indoor runners (MUST be clean)

Attire- Something dancers feel comfortable moving and sweating in - no jeans.

*Tights: CONVERTIBLE- have a hole in the bottom of the foot to allow conversion into bare feet. CAPRI- have no foot coverage.

Available Classes and Genre Information

Tiny Dancers (Ages 18 months-4 years) (ages 3+ - MUST be 3 upon classes starting in September)

Learn basic skills that will establish skills in your little one that will enable them to progress into specialized genres when their bodies and minds are ready. Creative dance develops movement skills, with musicality, while keeping young minds open to interpretation. Your dancer will develop strength, flexibility and rhythm through guided instruction.

BALLET, JAZZ & HIP HOP classes available for all tiny dancers.

Ballet (Ages 5+)

*The Cecchetti Ballet Syllabus & Classical Ballet Progressions of Canada are taught by the area's only trained and certified ballet teacher. Dancers learn ballet and dance techniques that will establish a strong technical base for other genres and promote safe practice. Exams are offered in the Accelerated level and provide individuals with attainable goals to reach and gain recognition for their achievements.

Jazz (Ages 5+)

A high energy dance style that incorporates sharp, controlled movements and typically incorporates pop music. Although there are many different styles of Jazz, most children's jazz is linked closely to ballet technique then progresses with experience.

AcroDance (Ages 5+)

The ACROBATIC ARTS syllabus is taught by certified instructors and is based on safe and effective progressions in five divisions of AcroDance: Flexibility, Strength, Balancing, Limbering, and Tumbling. Participants learn skills and must pass all skills in each division before entering the next level.

Contemporary (Based on age and experience of your dancer)

An expressive dance that incorporates elements of several dance genres including ballet, jazz, lyrical, and modern. This is a mature style suited to older and experienced dancers.

Lyrical (Based on age and experience of your dancer)

Is a smooth moving dance form that merges jazz and ballet techniques and typically uses the lyrics of the music to accentuate a story or feeling.

Modern (Based on age and experience of your dancer)

Is a genre of dance that was created as a contrast to classical ballet to create more freedom in movement.

Tap (Ages 5+)

Using specialized shoes with metal taps on the heel and ball of foot, dancers create music with their feet. A sense of rhythm and musicality is developed through tap dance.

Hip Hop

Is a high energy street dance style that focuses on body isolations and freestyle movements. Danced to hip hop, rap and pop music it is an area of dance that is constantly evolving and developing.

Competitive Dancers

Introduction:

Dear parents of Competitive level dancers,

Please review the following. This information will give you lots of time to plan for festival and performance dates, and to consider the policies and ensure they align with your dancer's, and your family's values and commitment to dance and the team.

What is "Competitive"?

This term reflects both aspects of this level; training & performance.

Goals of the competitive classes:

- Have a strong sense of TEAM commitment.
- Create and reach GOALS set for each group, and all individuals.
- Higher expectation for attendance, and work ethic in and out of class.
- Participate in more festivals than Performance Level.
- Have opportunities for local performances.
- Option for extra numbers like solos/duets/trios.

• Ability to participate in exams for acro, and or ballet (which is highly encouraged to provide attainable goals, and progress technical capabilities).

Policy Background:

To help everyone understand the reasoning behind policies: These policies are not new. Instructors discuss these values on a regular basis in class, but sometimes parents don't receive the same discussion.

- Competitive group choreography is more detailed and intricate (especially for older dancers), so a
 missing dancer in a performance affects the entire group. Missing dancers can require changes to
 choreography and placements to be re-worked, which creates extra work for the teachers and
 students- valuable time that could be spent cleaning and making the dance routine better.
- The weeks leading up to festivals are our "cleaning" classes. When dancers miss a class (especially many weeks in a row) that individual dancer misses important information, and practice time which affects the group. It also hinders the individual's own knowledge and confidence.
- Dance is a progressive sport/art. Each practice builds strength, technique, muscle memory, and confidence (to name a few). Missing classes means losing that practice which can slow progress (even regress), while the rest of their class progresses. Think of dance class as climbing stairseach class enables you to take a step. Missing a class keeps you on the same step (OR maybe take a step back) while others take their next step.

Policies:

ABSENCES:

- Extensive, recurring, or prolonged absences, will result in a review of participation in performances. IE) Hard work to gain the reward, and Team first. 2 or more consecutive weeks will result in a review of festival participation.
- Dancers must attend all classes within the 4-5 weeks leading up to festival. These are our 'cleaning' weeks and important to individuals and the team.
- Guest choreography (scheduled some weekends in September/October) PLUS additional cleaning dates on weekends through the year will be mandatory for all dancers in the group.
 Dates to be released at the beginning of the season.
- Holidays/Vacations We're encouraging families to consider the dates the studio will be closed while planning for holidays and vacations. Please consult the schedule in this handbook for studio closures and important festival dates when planning vacations and holidays.

• **Note:** Understandably, emergencies and illness can arise, and the studio is sympathetic to special situations; however, dancers are expected to be able to manage their time with homework and social events to allow for their ongoing commitment to their team.

NON-COMPETE CLAUSE:

- We expect a certain level of loyalty from our Competitive dancers. Being a Competitive dancer at Slave Lake Dance Creations means that our studio will be the priority when it comes to class commitments and festivals. Failing to do so will result in a review of festival participation.
- All dancers that are involved, registered or participating in groups, studios or organizations outside of Slave Lake Dance Creations must disclose any additional classes to the Artistic Director.
- All dances choreographed within Dance Creations must be registered at all festivals and workshops under Dance Creations.

- Regular Festival and Costume Fees, as outlined in this handbook, would also apply to this
 routine.
- Deadline to enroll your dancer in this routine is August 15th

Solo/Duo/Small Group DESCRIPTIONS & DETAILS

Solo- 1 person performs an individual routine, choreographed specifically for that dancer. Dancers are expected to rehearse on their own time to be prepared for each meeting with the choreographer.

- 2 minute solo choreography, and in their own space.
- 3.0 hours of private instruction.
- Scheduled practice times directly through the choreographer.
- Choreography costs vary based on instructor.
- Solos automatically registered for the same festivals as group participation.
- Festival registrations: APPROX \$60/ festival.
- Costume preference <u>must</u> be communicated to the choreographer, and <u>must</u> be confirmed to the Artistic Director prior to October 1st. Costumes will be charged to your account along with all

group costumes, if you choose to reuse a costume the costume deposit will be credited back to your account.

- Costumes: can use previously worn costumes, or purchased new through the studios bulk ordering.
- All choreography fees must be paid in full <u>prior</u> to starting choreography and will be non-refundable.
- Costume Fees DUE October 15 and are non-refundable.
- Festival Fees DUE November 30 and are non-refundable.

Duet- 2 dancers perform a routine, choreographed specifically for those dancers. Duets require additional rehearsal time to practice together on their own time and in their own space.

- 2.5 minutes duet choreography.
- 4 hours of private instruction.
- Scheduled practice times directly through the choreographer.
- Choreography costs vary based on instructor-
- Automatically registered for the same festivals as group participation.
- Festival registrations: APPROX \$60/ dancer, per festival.
- Costume preference <u>must</u> be communicated to the choreographer, and <u>must</u> be confirmed to the
 Artistic Director prior to October 1st. Costumes will be charged to your account along with all
 group costumes, if you choose to reuse a costume the costume deposit will be credited back to
 your account.
- Costumes: can use previously worn costumes, or purchased new through the studios bulk ordering.
- All choreography fees must be paid in full <u>prior</u> to starting choreography and will be non-refundable.
- Costume Fees DUE October 15 and are non-refundable.
- Festival Fees DUE November 30 and are non-refundable.

Trio- 3 dancers perform a routine,

- Same details as duet (above)
- Choreography costs vary based on instructor.

SOLO/DUO/SMALL GROUP REQUESTS:

If your dancer is interested in a Solo, Duet or Trio please follow these steps prior to the cut off of July 15, 2024

- To request a solo, duet or trio for your dancer, please register them in the "Competitive Extra Solo" or "Competitive Extra Duet", or "Competitive Extra Trio" through your Jackrabbit parent portal. Also ensure that all parties involved have also registered as well. Registering your dancer does not ensure they will be guaranteed a routine. After your child is registered, the Artistic Director will work with instructors to connect your dancer with the choreographer that they feel will be best suited to the discipline they feel will be strongest and suited for. They may not get their first choice of discipline or choreographer.
- All solos must be registered through the studio and compete under DANCE CREATIONS at all competitions.
- The following benchmarks are taken into consideration of what solos, duets and trios will be selected for the year.

BENCHMARKS:

Each year, instructors and the Artistic Director will consider the following benchmarks when assessing a dancer's readiness for an extra routine. If your dancer is not ready for an extra routine this season, you will be provided with feedback and a written note with explanation.

Benchmarks are:

- o Past attendance, and active participation in <u>all</u> their classes.
- o Ability to remember choreography and teacher feedback in their classes.
- o Musicality and coordination of timing, and steps.
- o Personality and confidence to perform onstage alone (use of facial expressions and energy while performing).
- o Ability to learn choreography quickly, and recall for future practices.
- o Workload of dancers existing group choreography for season.
- o Ability to meet, or exceed technical benchmarks for group level (described in written notes).
- Ability to accept constructive feedback in a positive manner.

Approval:

Instructors along with the Artistic Director will communicate via email, their suggestion on the genre and instructor choice. Then will get approval from the parent for genre, instructor, and cost. After approval and payment is received, choreography planning with your dancer's instructor will commence.

Student Choreography:

Chosen with the approval of the Artistic Director. Maximum 1 student choreographed number/dancer.

These are for COMPETITIVE DANCERS who have a minimum of 2 solos choreographed by choreographers working for DANCE CREATIONS.

Student choreography is SELF choreography and not choreography for other dancers (unless there is consent from the Artistic Director).

After approval, dancers will work with the Artistic Director to create concepts, pick music and costuming so there is no overlapping with other solos.

All student choreographers will be allotted 3 hours of studio time which must not interfere with other choreography or classes that need to be held by teachers/choreographers hired by Dance Creations. All Student Choreography solos must be registered under DANCE CREATIONS at all competitions they perform at.
