DURTY NELLY'S – 400 YEARS OF IRISH CHEER

In the shadow of Bunratty Castle and on the banks of the Ralty River, County Clare, sits one of Ireland's most well-known pubs. For 400 years patrons have frequented Durty Nelly's for food and drink. Both Irish and tourists alike flock to this famous site to sip on a well-drawn pint and take in the breathtaking scenery. With Bunratty Castle as a backdrop, the Irish atmosphere could not be better. But who was Durty Nelly?

Living in the Cratloe's countryside lived a lady who was known simply as Durty Nelly. Many were puzzled at this strange lady and her name, but, Durty Nelly soon found a way to make a living. She was heartbroken over a loveless marriage and one with no children. She brought some of Nelly's whiskey home, and her husband was a changed man! Caring and loving, they would eventually live a long happy life with 5 children.

The legend of Durty Nelly's poteen (the name for the special whiskey) would travel fast. From

Garlic-Basil Tomatoes with Mozzarella

Betty Crocker Kitchens



- Prep 10 MIN
 - Total 3 HR 10 MIN
 - Servings 8
- This salad is the perfect showcase for your fresh garden tomatoes and basil!

Ingredients

4 medium tomatoes, cut into 1/4-inch slices
 1/4 cup plus 1 tablespoon olive or vegetable oil
 3 tablespoons red wine vinegar
 1 tablespoon chopped fresh basil leaves or 1 teaspoon dried basil leaves
 1/8 teaspoon salt
 3 drops red pepper sauce
 2 large garlic cloves, finely chopped
 8 ounces fresh mozzarella cheese, sliced
 Salad greens, if desired

Steps

- 1 Place tomatoes in glass or plastic dish.
- 2 Shake remaining ingredients except cheese and salad greens in tightly covered container. Pour over tomatoes. Cover and refrigerate at least 3 hours to blend flavors, turning occasionally.
- 3 Layer cheese alternately with tomatoes on salad greens.
- **Expert Tips**
- The fresh mozzarella cheese called for in this recipe is a soft white cheese with a mild,

delicate flavor. It has a different flavor than regular mozzarella and can be found in Italian markets, cheese shops and some supermarkets.

Tomato and Mozzarella Pitas are as easy as serving this fragrant mixture in pita bread halves.

Cucumber Salad

- Prep 10 MIN
- Total 3 HR 10 MIN
- Servings 6

A perfect side dish for a hot weather meal, this light and easy cucumber salad is an excellent accompaniment to seafood, chicken or grilled red meat. Paper-thin slices of cucumber are tossed in a light vinegar mixture and allowed to marinate for a few hours to deepen the flavor.

Ingredients

2 medium cucumbers, thinly sliced
1/3 cup cider or white vinegar
1/3 cup water
2 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
Chopped fresh dill weed or parsley, if desired

Steps

1 Place cucumbers in small glass or plastic bowl.
2 In tightly covered container, shake remaining ingredients except dill weed. Pour over cucumbers. Cover and refrigerate at least 3 hours to blend flavors.
3 Drain cucumbers. Sprinkle with

dill weed. Store covered in refrigerator.

Expert Tips

Serve these cukes with grilled salmon or chicken. Or spoon some onto a grilled burger with sliced tomatoes or layer into a homemade Dagwood sub sandwich.

After draining the cucumbers, stir in 3/4 cup sour cream or plain yogurt. Serve with an assortment of other small salads at a picnic buffet.

Stir in 1 thinly sliced red onion with the cucumbers; they become extra sweet and any pungency is tamed.

- This is almost like a quick pickle, allowing the cucumbers to marinate in the tangy-sweet dressing just until the cucumbers wilt and are deliciously tender. Fresh dill or fennel fronds, a pinch of allspice, whole coriander seed or a bay leaf added during the marinating time all add an aromatic herbal note.
