

Church donates children's mitts, hats, socks

Willa Burke of Cordova Bay United Church Monday delivered two large bags full of children's clothing to the Cridge Centre for the Family. The new mitts, hats and socks will go to support children in need.

The CBUC congregation made the donations as part of its celebration of the 100th anniversary of the United Church of Canada.

The United Church was inaugurated on June 10, 1925 in Toronto, Ontario, when the Methodist Church, the Congregational Union and 70 percent of The Presbyterian Church in Canada entered into a union.

Cordova Bay United is celebrating the 100th anniversary by raising \$25,000 for the United Church's Mission and Service Fund. The Mission and Service Fund provides clean water, food, shelter, medical aid, community of faith support, refugee programs and emergency aid — both in Canada around the world.

During this anniversary year, Cordova Bay United is also supporting local groups in need with special fundraising campaigns.
