Soup fundraiser draws a crowd

A couple centimetres of snow that fell overnight wasn't enough to stop Cordova Bay United Church hall from being filled Sunday for a soup and bun lunch.

The lunch followed the worship service and preceded the annual general meeting.

A group of church women led by Linda Smith-McMahon and Susanne Morgan set up, made and served the lunch, and then cleaned up afterwards.

Entry to the lunch was by donation and more than \$500 was raised. The funds will go towards the 2023 church budget.







Annual General Meeting a success

More than 60 people turned out for the CBUC Annual General Meeting Sunday following the worship service and soup and bun lunch.

Chair Jiemei Li welcomed everyone and thanked the congregation for their hard work throughout the past year. Jiemei noted because of COVID restrictions, for the first three months of the year the church did not have in-person worship services.

"We have endured a lot," said Jiemei.

Nevertheless, the church ended the year with inperson worship attendance almost back to pre-COVID levels, a significant number of people who attend online via livestreaming and recorded services, children and youth programs back in full swing, and a balanced budget.

AGM approves 2023 budget

The congregation unanimously approved a budget for 2023 totalling \$373,110 — which is actually \$4,096 less than what the church spent in 2022.

The budget includes a 3.3 per cent increase in givings — from \$287,065 last year to \$296,560 in 2023. That includes \$14,530 for the Mission and Service Fund.

The budget includes \$19,950 in fundraisers. Some of that — more than \$500 — was raised during the soup and bunch lunch before the meeting.

The church will not be putting on a Country Fair this year but has kept the same date in May for a fundraiser of some kind. The church will need fundraise in order to meet its budget, but will be considering fundraisers that require less physical work than the Country Fair.

Congregation meeting set for March 12

Chair Jiemei Li announced a special congregational meeting for March 12 to consider the report from the Discernment Task Group.

The report sets out Cordova Bay United's priorities for the next three years. It also provides a recommendation about ministry staffing levels going forward.

Erich Schulz of the task group told the AGM that a draft of its report had been sent to the United Church's Pacific Mountain Region for review and input.

The report went to the church council for consideration on Wednesday.
