

Alexander Galant - Biography

Alexander Galant is a director, screenwriter, and novelist. Working in almost every technical position in theatre gave Alexander the background to direct some highly technically challenging productions such as *Singin'* in the Rain where it rained across the entire stage. The Wizard of Oz was one of the first productions in the GTA to use projections to mix computer-generated fx with live action. Recently *Titanic the Musical* where he created the illusion of the sinking at the St Jacobs Country Playhouse.

His experience as an actor has been helpful when directing more character-driven shows such as Les Misérables, Twelve Angry Men, Love Letters, and the Toronto Premiere of the new adaptation of The Diary of Anne Frank.

Alexander was offered full Equity Membership after directing *Anne Frank* but had to turn it down due to the

financial responsibilities of a new baby on the way.

Taking a leave of absence from theatre, Alexander was the historical researcher and ghostwriter of a Gothic novel (with Shakespearean elements) that was on the *New York Times Best Sellers List* and, followed up by publishing his own award-winning novel.

Alexander earns his living working in the film industry, had been a full member of the Directors Guild of Canada, and is currently freelancing as a script supervisor with IATSE. He has written and directed his own award-winning films and recently directed extra scenes and special effects sequences for the TV series *CHUCKY* (second season).
