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Weaving Workshop with Cheryl Peebles

Re-using, or re-cycling (or 'upcycling') materials is great for the environment and 'rags' can be turned into something new and useful. Cheryl Peebles will share some of her hints, tips and 'tricks' for working with materials that have lived a different life. Recycled materials can be used for rugs, yes, but also garments, bags, and so many other uses. Cheryl brings a wealth of experience to working with upcycling materials. And the guild even has a rag cutter if anyone decides they want to pursue this further. :)

Cheryl will also have a pop-up store during the workshop—but we need enough people to make the class 'go'! So register sooner rather than later. There are hotels/motels within easy drive of the Studio 2880 complex. We have booked the large room on the ground floor, so no carrying looms up the stairs to the guild room. Yes, there are a few table looms for rent from the guild for the workshop.

Needle Felted Gnomes (1 hour 23 minutes)



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Back by popular demand. In this video, you will learn how to make your own needle-felted gnome ornaments. As you work through the process of making these cute little gnomes, from set-up to finishing, and soon you'll be making a whole group of your own. Bring any needle felting supplies you have. Different colors of wool to use to make the gnome (the coarser, the better), some curly fiber

that can be use for a beard/hair, an image of a gnome to use for inspiration, needles, foam block, scissors, sewing needle and thread, embroidery floss to use for details. Some supplies available at the Guild. Needles and felting kits can be purchased through the Guild.

Material Fee: \$5 members or \$10 non-members plus GST. Pre-registration is not required.
