Speaking of rent, the City of Prince George City Council unanimously voted in favour of the new creative hub. City Council approved the application to the Investing in Canada Infrastructure funding program, in the amount of \$4.12 million for construction. The City committed a further \$1.5 million cash towards the cost of construction. This means the total budget for the construction will be \$5.62 million. So what happens next? We wait to find out if the funding application was successful. If it is then we could expect to start design and construction planning in 2021, with construction occurring in 2022. Then it is time for the Guild to pack up and move to the new creative hub. After a long wait and cancellation of many of our events due to COVID, it is great to have

Sunday Seminar Series

The planning for the Sunday morning seminars is going well with the first six booked. Laura is working on the second half of 2021 and already has instructors signed up until October, waiting to hear from on topics. Some of these names listed above you may recognize, some you may not. But all of them have interesting things to say about fibre, spinning, weaving, etc. The seminars will be via Zoom.

PG Fibre Arts Guild members can start to purchase seminars online Wednesday, October 28 at 7:00pm for \$10.50 (\$10 plus GST) while non-members will pay \$15.75 (\$15 plus GST). Cost for a Guild to view as a group (with only one participant signing in) is \$52.50 (\$50 plus GST). We can have up to six people who have purchased their seminar to view the Zoom seminar in our Guild Room (to provide social distancing) for those who have an unreliable or no internet connection.

With a 10:00 am start time, we can access presenters who live in different time zones.

Laura's overall theme is how textiles intersect and inform culture. The seminars are general overviews, not technique oriented. Depending on how many teachers get teaching seminars or workshops ready, we could also run teaching seminars in the future. Now that the CAC has arranged for more robust internet in the building, we can take advantage of being able to learn remotely, even if we cannot run the 'usual' workshops.

If we are still dealing with the pandemic well into next year, Laura is willing to continue contacting presenters and booking them on into 2022.

But for now, we have a great line up and will share more info as it comes available.
