The Kilmichael Ambush

A few months ago, I wrote about General Tom Barry, the Irish hero during the War of Independence that followed the Easter Rising. Barry, like Michael Collins, hailing from Cork would help contribute to the County being known as the "Rebel County". Carried out by the Irish Republican Army on 28 November 1920, the Kilmichael Ambush is considered one of the most militarily significant events of this era. With political significance as well, the Ambush would mark an escalation of the war.

Easy Meatless Lasagna

Betty Crocker Kitchens

- Prep 20 MIN
- Total 1 HR 35 MIN
- Servings 8

Ingredients

- 2 cups ricotta cheese or small curd creamed cottage cheese
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh oregano leaves or 1 ½ teaspoons dried oregano leaves
- 2 jars (28 ounces each) tomato pasta sauce (any variety)
- 12 uncooked lasagna noodles
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese (8 ounces)
- ¼ cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Additional shredded mozzarella cheese, if desired

Steps

- 1 Heat oven to 350°F. Mix ricotta cheese, ½ cup Parmesan cheese, the parsley and oregano.

- 2 Spread 2 cups of the pasta sauce in ungreased rectangular pan, 13x9x2 inches; top with 4 uncooked noodles. Spread ricotta cheese mixture over noodles. Spread with 2 cups pasta sauce and top with 4 noodles; repeat with 2 cups pasta sauce and 4 noodles. Sprinkle with 2 cups mozzarella cheese. Spread with remaining pasta sauce. Sprinkle with ¼ cup Parmesan cheese.
- 3 Cover and bake 30 minutes. Uncover and bake about 30 minutes longer or until hot and bubbly. Sprinkle with additional mozzarella cheese. Let stand 15 minutes before cutting.
