- **Lost Girls of Paris** by **Pam Jenoff** - From the author of *The Orphan's Tale* comes a remarkable story of friendship and courage centered around three women and a ring of female spies during World War II.
- **Where the Crawdads Sing** by **Delia Owens** - a story of resiliency, survival, hope, love, loss, loneliness, desperation, prejudice, determination and strength. There is a love story and mystery woven through the story, and add art and poetry to that and you have this incredible book.
- **Watching You** by **Lisa Jewell** – her latest thriller examines the secrets and obsessions of a seemingly idyllic neighborhood. A clever, unputdownable, and suspenseful psychological thriller novel.

FEATURED DVD MOVIES

- **Mary Poppins Returns** – a seamless blend of old and new. Features some terrific live-action/animation combos with Emily Blunt's fantastic performance that is entertaining and heart tugging!
- **Green Book** - When a bouncer from an Italian-American neighborhood in the Bronx, is hired to drive (a world-class Black pianist, on a concert tour from Manhattan to the Deep South, they must rely on "The Green Book" to guide them to the few establishments that were then safe for African-Americans. Confronted with racism, danger-as well as unexpected humanity and humor-they are forced to set aside differences to survive and thrive on the journey of a lifetime.
- **Spider-Man: Into the Spider-verse**- matches bold storytelling with striking animation for a purely enjoyable adventure with heart, humor, and plenty of superhero action.
- **The Mule** - loosely based on a true story; with a nice storytelling swing. This will surely please fans of Clint Eastwood, who after being fired from his job of many years, the now 90-year-old man turns to smuggling drugs in the back of his truck, while trying to rebuild the bridge to his disassociated family.
