## **Program Coordinator's Report**

Cranbrook and District Restorative Justice Society has signed an agreement with the Ministry of Safety and the Office of the Solicitor General to deliver restorative practice in the province. CDRJS works with the RCMP and Crown to address the court diversion files that are appropriate as defined by the Community Justice Forum training.

In a similar fashion, CDRJS holds a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with School District 5 (Southeast Kootenay) defining the contacts and approaches that SD5 may use to access services with CDRJS.

We are currently working on a similar MOU with the Ktunaxa Nation Council to provide services and support as KNC works toward greater independence from formal court processes..

The goal in our service delivery continues to focus on improving consistency and turn-around time. As the total number of trained facilitators was lower than required to support the increase in file referrals, Debbie and Doug McPhee two training sessions for Community Justice Forum Facilitators.

The first of the two sessions was held in October of 2016 and served the dual purpose of training new facilitators and providing upgrading for certified facilitators in Cranbrook and District. The second session was held in January 2017 and 13 new facilitators successfully completed the three-day training.

CDRJS has been actively involved in committee work provincially and federally in support of developing provincial and federal standards of practice with societies

In July of 2016, CDRJS Board Members were engaged in a second Strategic Planning Review. Strategic Planning produces a path for the organization to follow for the next 12 months. Although flexibility is often a daily requirement when dealing with people, budgets and funding sources within the environment of the not-for-profit world, the strategic plan helps to identify those key goals that CDRJS needs to return to when the smoke clears.

The New Board for 2017 will be well served by the guiding path left by the current board and in July, they will be provided with an equal opportunity to modify the path they wish CDRJS to follow.

#### **Total Files and Outcome**

There were 31 files referred to CDRJS in 2016. Files from the RCMP have the year as the prefix; 2016-982 is the first file for 2016 and 2016-9722 is the last in this set. There is an overlap from one year to the next as files that are referred in December may take 3 months to conclude – well into the following year. The cleanest method to report files in a given year is to reference the RCMP file number.
