Our Festival Adjudicator, Neil Freeman, is Assistant Dean in the Faculty of Fine Arts at York University. He has an extensive background in theatre both as an actor and director. His performing background includes assignments at Edmonton's Citadel Theatre, the Alberta Festival Theatre, and as a member of the Stratford Festival Company. He has directed works for Theatre Calgary, the Banff Festival of the Arts and York University. Mr Freeman also has extensive experience in radio and television, and has conducted workshops in theatre arts and crafts throughout Ontario under Theatre Ontario's Community Theatre Training Program.
