

Distinguished Lecturer Karen Rollins

Topic: Confessions of an Indoor Air Quality Consultant

Biography:

Karen Rollins began her career with a diploma in Architectural Technology from the Northern Albert Institute of Technology. (1981). She followed this with a BSc (Biology) from the University of Edmonton (1986), and with a Master of Environmental Design from the University of Calgary (1998). For the past ten years, she has conducted IAQ building investigations, and consulted to individuals and organizations wishing to reduce the risk of IAQ problems.

Among her varied work experience, she has prepared court trial documents, has lectured in the University of Calgary's Continuing Education Management Certificate Program, prepared lecture course packages for SAIT (HVAC Certificate Program) and Mt. Royal College's Continuing Education Program (Indoor Air Quality for the Homeowner). Karen has also published and presented a technical paper on indoor air quality management at an international in Beijing (2005).

Karen has served for three years on the Board of the ASHRAE Southern Alberta Chapter, is a member of the Canadian Green Building Council, and is a certified mould remediation supervisor, among other affiliations. March Meeting Summary – Humidification

Serge Landry, of Vapac, offered a Power Point presentation on humidification technologies. In general, humidifiers may be classified as *adiabatic*, in which there is no heat transfer into the air- water vapour mixture, and *isothermal*, where sufficient heat energy is added to the air to maintain the air-water vapour mixture at a constant temperature.


There are four major reasons why humidification is important:

- 1. Health and comfort of people
- 2. Provide a controlled environment for a process
- 3. Maintain physical quality/integrity of materials
- 4. Eliminate static electricity shocks

Serge then reviewed the features of common types of humidifiers, including:


- 1. Electrode Type Humidifiers
- 2. Resistance Type Humidifiers
- 3. Gas-Fired Type Humidifiers
- 4. Heat Exchanger Type Humidifiers
- 5. Steam Distributors
- 6. Short absorption manifold
- 7. Humidifier Controls


