The Best Prime Rib

Level: Easy

Total: 10 hr (includes chilling and resting times)

Active: 20 min

Yield: 6 to 8 servings

For our Sunday roast, we went with a foolproof reverse sear method – cooking the roast low and slow then finishing with an

incredibly high heat – to get a juicy, perfectly medium-rare roast from edge to edge. The low heat dries the surface which allows the high heat to crisp it up nicely. And a long cooking time with a low, gentle heat avoids the gray band of overcooked meat that usually happens when you sear first.

Ingredients

Deselect All

One 3-rib standing rib roast (7 to 8 pounds)

2 cloves garlic thinly sliced.

1/4 cup kosher salt

2 tablespoons black or tricolor peppercorns, coarsely ground

Directions

Pat the skin of the roast completely dry and place on a cutting board, fat-side up. Use a paring knife to make small slits all over the fat, and then stud the meat with the garlic slices. Sprinkle all over with the salt and pepper, wrap tightly with plastic wrap and refrigerate for 4 hours and up to overnight. Preheat the oven to 250 degrees F. Unwrap the roast and place fat-side up on a rack set in a roasting pan.

Roast the meat until an instant-read thermometer inserted into the center of the meat registers 120 degrees F, about 4 hours. Remove from the oven and let sit for 1 hour. The temperature will continue to rise another 10 to 14 degrees as it sits.

Turn the oven to 500 degrees F. Place the roast back in the oven and bake until the fatty skin starts to crisp up and turn golden brown, 10 to 15 minutes. Let rest another 30 minutes before transferring to a cutting board for slicing.



Crispiest Ever Potatoes

Total: 1 hr 45 min (includes
drying time)

Active: 20 min

Yield: 6 servings

Somewhere between oven-roasted potatoes and crispy hash, these little creamer potatoes are boiled in water with baking soda before being smashed. The alkaline in the baking soda helps the skins crisp up quickly. Smashing increases their surface area and contact with the pan. The result is the crunchiest-ever crust.

Ingredients

Deselect All

1 ½ pounds small creamer
potatoes

1 tablespoon baking soda

Kosher salt and freshly ground
black pepper.

1/3 cup extra-virgin olive oil

5 cloves garlic, skins on,
smashed.

Leaves from 5 sprigs fresh
thyme

Leaves from 1 sprig fresh
rosemary

Directions

Preheat the oven to 450F.

Add the potatoes to a large
saucepan and cover with cold
water by 1 inch. Add the baking
soda and 1 tablespoon salt to the
water. Cover, place over
medium-high heat and bring to a
boil. Uncover and continue to
boil until the potatoes give easily
when pierced with the tip of a
knife, 15 to 20 minutes. Drain the
potatoes and set the strainer over
the top of the pan for a few

minutes so the outsides of the
potatoes can dry.

Dump the potatoes onto a baking
sheet. Drizzle with the oil and
toss with the garlic, thyme and
rosemary until the potatoes are
completely coated in the oil.
Sprinkle generously with salt and
pepper. Using a small juice glass
or glass bowl, smash each potato
firmly but gently. (You want to
just crack the skins and flatten
slightly while keeping the
potatoes mostly intact.)
Roast until the bottoms of the
potatoes are deep golden brown,
20 to 25 minutes. Remove the
baking sheet from the oven and
flip the potatoes using a spatula.
Roast until the potatoes are
golden brown and crispy on both
sides, an additional 20 to 25
minutes. Transfer to a platter with
a metal spatula. Serve while hot.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

PARADE STARTS 1:00PM

Line Up 11:30 AM

This is a Judged Parade

1. Units are to line up in the Kingston Plaza at 11:30 AM
 - a. Kingston Police Department will close Westbrook Lane at 12:15PM
 - b. The best entrance to the Plaza is via Plaza Road. (MAC GYM side of Plaza)
2. One person from each unit should check in at the parade headquarters located in Chic's Restaurant. (11:30AM-12:15PM) A Parade ribbon will be given to each unit at the registration table to be displayed in the parade.
3. Parade Marshals are the officials for the parade and their instructions are final. Any unit disregarding official's instructions will forfeit its participation in the parade.
4. The parade committee reserves the right to screen all units for objectionable material to the celebration of the feast of St. Patrick and the Irish race. Any objectionable material must be removed before participating in the parade.
5. Parade Marshals have the final line of March and the list of unit numbers and final lineup instructions. If there are any questions concerning the line of March, consult them. The Line of March will move from the Plaza promptly at 12:45PM SHARP. Please be ready!
6. Fire Companies: IMPORTANT --No Sirens--. In case of emergency, if a response is necessary, trucks will move FORWARD ONLY on the LEFT SIDE of the Parade until there is an opportunity to make a LEFT OR RIGHT TURN off the parade route. At the direction of the Kingston Police Department, on lower Broadway in the Rondout, trucks must NOT attempt to go back up against the parade. Instead, they should proceed to Delaware Avenue and to their destination.
7. **At the end of the parade, cars, trucks, and floats should not stop or leave the parade route until they have passed the Maritime Museum.**
8. Kingston has an open container law. It is the responsibility of each unit coordinator to see that NO consumption of alcohol takes place while the parade is in progress.
9. **PLEASE DO NOT THROW CANDY OR OTHER GOODIES FROM CARS, FLOATS, OR TRUCKS.** Doing so creates a serious safety problem with the potential of a young child being struck by a moving vehicle. Walkers may hand things out at the edge of the parade route. **UNITS FAILING TO DO SO WILL FORFEIT PARTICIPATION IN THIS AND NEXT YEARS' PARADE.**
10. Units are expected to keep pace with the unit in front of them. Please close up any spaces that develop between units.
11. The Official reviewing stand is on the right at the foot of Broadway, immediately after making the left turn onto the Strand.
