Introduction to the Presentation

The Saint John Regional Hospital is a 1,134,000 sq ft healthcare facility in Saint John, NB. It is the largest Hospital in the Province of New Brunswick, and is the primary cardiac care and trauma facility for NB. The Hospital was designed and constructed in the late 1970s, and opened to patients in 1982. At the time, the Hospital was incredibly energy efficient, featuring many energy saving measures that would be considered advanced today.

The Saint John Regional Hospital Energy Retrofit project was undertaken to modernize the facility's chilled water and heating water systems. We will explore the existing and new distribution systems, modifications made to the system, and new control strategies that have been added to maximize energy performance. We will also review lessons learned from the project, as well as operator experiences with the new system.

This project has been nominated for an ASHRAE Technology Award after having been recognized at the Regional level. The Technology Award program will also be discussed in the presentation.

Robert Hoadley, P. Eng, is a mechanical consultant and partner with Argyll Associates Limited of Fredericton, NB. His primary areas of practice are commercial and institutional building design, with a specialty focus in health-care facilities. He has worked in the consulting business for 13 years, all with small mechanical consultancies.

Robert is a graduate of the University of New Brunswick, with a Bachelor of Science in Engineering (Mechanical). He is a member of the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of New Brunswick, Engineers Nova Scotia, and is a LEED Accredited Professional in Building Design and Construction. 
