

Dear Friends in Christ,

Every year around this time I write you a letter such as this. It's generally called a Pastoral Letter, as I aim to offer some reflections on the upcoming season and invite your contemplation and action, as appropriate. These are intended to help us enter into the seasons of Advent and Christmas in a certain mindset—ideally one that will allow us to experience the fullness and richness that each of these seasons has to offer.

I have been struggling to write this letter, for some time, as my heart and mind have been overwhelmed with thoughts and emotions concerning the conflict happening in the Holy Land. This conflict is as much about politics as it is about religion, and that has been weighing on me as I thought about how to approach this letter. I recently read that there is talk of a ceasefire and the release of hostages. I hope that our collective prayers for peace, as well as a sense of mutual understanding and the desire to preserve human life and end the suffering of far too many, will see this come to fruition.

For many of us this conflict, as well as others happening around the world, can seem very far off, as though they have no impact on our daily lives. In several ways that is true, however we know from experience that the global community is much closer than it appears. Over recent years we have learned that viruses can spread rapidly across oceans, we have seen how political protests can be coordinated across countries, and we have witnessed how images of war, violence and destruction can be broadcast not just into our homes but into our hands through electronic devices. We are more connected than ever and, as such, we are all impacted by crises and events both locally and around the world.

This year our parish has been challenged to be more vocal, and to raise awareness about ongoing crises, injustices and identified community needs. There have been visible reminders to our community through the Red Dress project, awareness flags, coloured ribbons, and community projects receiving media coverage. I have also done my best to address these things in my weekly emails and sermons. All this work is essential to the work of the church and the communities we serve.

So what does this have to do with Advent and Christmas? Well, Advent is the time of preparation, leading up to Christmas. Not just a time of preparing our homes with decorations but also a time of personal and communal preparation for the arrival of the Messiah. The baby Jesus grew into a man who preached a message of servitude and peace. He taught his disciples ways to live their lives, in such a way that demonstrated love. This type of teaching was counter-cultural to what many were experiencing at that time and unfortunately it would appear that the same is, far too often, also true today. The wars, conflicts and crises around the world, and in our community, are not born out of love, but rather a desire for power. We are now called upon as modern-day disciples to spread a message of love and peace within a world that seeks power through violent means. We do this through word and action. I am not suggesting we take sides in violent actions; rather that we stand in the midst of it and call for peace. This is how we prepare. This is how we ready ourselves for Christmas and the event it celebrates.

In this time of preparation and celebration, may you not only know the peace and love of Jesus, but, may you also be a conduit through which that peace and love flows.

Archdeacon Brieanna has been pleased to offer assistance to many who are in need and she is able to do this using our "Helping Hands Fund". While the fund currently has a healthy balance, because of rising heating costs it is expected that there will be an even greater demand this winter (when needed, funds are paid directly to the oil company or NS Power). 
• MISSION TO SEAFARERS' SHOEBOXES: www.missiontoseafarershalifax.ca

At this time of year we prepare shoeboxes containing a variety of items to be given to seafarers visiting the port of Halifax at Christmas. Last year the Mission handed out over 1000 boxes to the crews of ships! Boxes are available at the back of each church with instructions for what is needed, and they can be returned there for pick up each Sunday. THE WORKINGS OF THE CHURCH


