ABSTRACT

One of the primary challenges for Facility Managers in the municipal sector is how to manage large portfolios of aging infrastructure. Service delivery to citizens may be adversely affected when building systems fail often as a result of millions of dollars of backlog in deferred maintenance and capital renewal requirements.

This presentation focuses on how decision-makers can leverage knowledge as well as technology to deliver excellence in facilities management within a limited budget. Solutions lie in utilizing strategies from internationally recognized competencies in facilities management, with a focus on IFMA competencies (International Facilities Management Association).


