EASY PINEAPPLE UPSIDE-DOWN CAKE

Betty Crocker



- Prep 15 Min
- Total 1 Hr. 40 Min
- Servings 12

Ingredients

- 1/4cup butter
- 1 cup packed brown sugar

- 1 can (20 oz) pineapple slices in juice, drained, juice reserved
- 1 jar (6 oz) maraschino cherries without stems, drained (about 18 cherries)
- 1 box Betty CrockerTM Super MoistTM Yellow Cake Mix
- Vegetable oil and eggs called for on cake mix box

Steps

- 1 Heat oven to 350°F (325°F for dark or nonstick pan).

 Melt butter in 13x9-inch pan in oven. Sprinkle brown sugar evenly over melted butter.

 Arrange pineapple slices on brown sugar. Place cherry in center of each pineapple slice, and arrange remaining cherries around slices; press gently into brown sugar.
- 2 Add enough water to reserved pineapple juice to measure 1 cup. Make cake batter as directed on box, substituting pineapple juice mixture for the water. Pour batter over pineapple and cherries.
- to 53 minutes for dark or nonstick pan) or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Immediately run knife around side of pan to loosen cake. Place heatproof serving plate upside down onto pan; turn plate and pan over. Leave pan over cake 5 minutes so brown sugar topping can drizzle over cake; remove pan. Cool 30 minutes. Serve warm or cool. Store covered in refrigerator.
