Hi Everyone,

- Secretary: This is not a function that can be done remotely as we require that person to take minutes at both our Executive meetings and our General Dinner meetings and then ready them for the eventual inclusion in the Newsletter.
- Newsletter Editor: There is no expectation for whoever may come forward that they would be expected to produce a document in the manner that I do. I have learned a great deal while doing this function and there will be assistance available to anyone that might be interested in addressing this vacancy in June 2025.
- Directors at Large: If someone is not sure how they might be able to help, and may be interested, you are welcome to come to our Executive meetings to see how the business is conducted. I am confident you will find something that would be of interest to you.

Meeting called to order: 9:56 am

Jerry Plastow on behalf of Barry Callbeck, Secretary:

- MOTION - Acceptance of minutes for August 22nd, 2024, meeting as sent by email recently, seconded by Bruce Allen – CARRIED

Kees Kikkert, President

- Association Council Meeting, September 11th, 2024, topics discussed:
 - Identify Priorities for the Association for the next 5 years.
 - Being worked on. It was agreed that Support Advocacy is very important; certainly a program that draws retired members to join the Association
 - Uniform & Dress Working Group (Tom Larkin)
 - Committee working group is on it. There is a need to update Vets old Dress manual, will be called the Dress Handbook. Things discussed were Stetson type head dress mainly for protection from the sun, women's blazer, some sort of Aboriginal sash.
 - Dues, Standardization of dues
 - Discussed if dues should be the same for every Division. Most agreed this is not likely.
 - Raising of dues. Following the raise of \$5.00 for 2025, most agreed if this doesn't rectify the money problems of the Association, to continue raising the dues is not the answer.
 - Membership Cards
 - Looking into a possible Membership Card for Active & Associate members
 - Associate Members – some Divn's ask for dues from Associate members, and they should be able to pay those dues via MMS.
 - Kees mentioned the Board of Directors Meeting Minutes of May 29th, 2024, and sent out September 3rd, 2024 – why does it take that long to get these minutes out?
- First female Troop 50 year Challenge Coins. Present them in person if possible and take picture of presentation.
- Payment of the \$220 by Force for grave marker prior to retired member passing. This was discussed at a recent National Warrant Officers Meeting and Leilani advised the intent of the policy is that this would take place after death. It was agreed at this National meeting that all Divisions would adhere to the policy going forward. NOTE: New information has come forward, to be discussed further at the next Executive Meeting.
- Chuck Neher has advised he is willing to take on Nick Taylor's duties on the Executive as the Liaison with Valour Place.
- Detachment Visits / presentation – Eric has recently attended Beaumont Detachment. Calgary visits their detachments in their area frequently. Kees has a presentation and can share it with anyone if anyone is going to a detachment in our area. We have a lot of detachments, most in the province, so its hard to get to all of them. Leilani suggested attending a District POWPM where all the Detachment Commanders attend.
- Awards Ceremony – Devon – We need one more for October 30th, Paul Gagne is going. Jerry will check his schedule and confirm.
- Hospital visitations – Jerry Forst is again doing these. Tom Dunlop advised to let us know when someone is in hospital earlier, so they can do the visits. Lately they have been finding out after they are out of hospital.

- Leilani attended the National Warrants Meeting recently. Various items were discussed.
- Headstones – The Annual inspections are taking place, and the Warrant Office is tracking them.
- Veterans Badges – This was brought up during the National Warrants meetings. There are further discussions taking place at the National level. All Warrants were unanimous we are all issued one badge for our service.
- Leilani was able to attend the 50th Anniversary Dinner of Women in the Force at the Heritage Center in Regina, along with the CO. Approximately 120 people were in attendance, including 19 Members of Troop 17.
- Valour Place Donation – K Division provided the maximum amount they could donate to Valour Place this year. Leilani will be the RCMP Rep on the Board/Committee.
- September 29th – Peace Officer Memorial – There will be lots of seating this year for any Vets that would like to attend.
- Appreciation Dinner – The CO is not able to make it, but A/Comm. Trevor Daroux will attend in his place.
- Tour of the Grey Cup with the CFL – There will be an event in Fort Saskatchewan at the Fort on October 19th. Do the Vets want to participate in the event? The Mayor and Council are aware, as well as Marg. Do we want to see if Kim and the Gift Shop would like to be there as well?

Valleyview Detachment Grand Opening

On Aug. 27, D/Commr. Rob Hill attended the official opening of the new Valleyview Detachment. The old detachment had been in service since the 1970's, but in 2012, it was identified for replacement. Construction on the new detachment didn't start until 2022, with the finishing touches to the building being completed in March of this year.

Members were very happy to move into the new detachment. The modern facility is net-zero ready and equipped with operation improvements that help area officers better perform their duties. During the grand opening ceremony, which was attended by local dignitaries, D/Commr. Hill reaffirmed the RCMP's commitment to the communities in Alberta, and commented on the importance of state of the art equipment for the members and the communities.

"The nature of policing is complex and ever-changing, and this new detachment will help ensure that we are well positioned to evolve and adapt, just as new technologies and the ways we keep communities safe also evolves."

Police and Peace Officers' National Memorial Day

Sept. 29 marked Police and Peace Officers' National Memorial Day, in which we joined together with fellow law enforcement across the country to remember those who lost their lives in the line of duty.

A number of employees and our Regimental Pipes and Drums had the honour of attending the Alberta Police and Peace Officer Memorial Day ceremony at the provincial legislature grounds. We stood side-by-side with our partners in law enforcement to remember the life and service of those who have gone before us, making the ultimate sacrifice for the safety of others.



Each year, names of fallen members are added to the Pillar of Strength monument as a reminder of their ultimate sacrifice. While the pillar serves as a physical reminder of these officers, their memories are carried with us each and every day in the work that we do. Honouring those who selflessly gave their lives to serve and protect others is important in ensuring their sacrifices are never forgotten. This year was particularly moving as it was the 20th anniversary of the passing of [Corporal Jim Galloway](#), who was killed in a standoff in Spruce Grove in 2004.
