property.

member to see if there was a possibility that the 4-H show and sale would be held in Castor at some point in time. She was informed that the 4-H clubs preferred their current

venue due to the dirt floor and ability to park trailers.

Trees on 51st Street:

Council was presented with two options of maple trees to line 51st Street. The Tatarian Maple or the Amur Maple. Both turn a bright red in the fall and both are approximately 15' at maximum height so they would fit under the power line.

Amur Maples will be placed on the east side and linden trees on the west side.

Committee Reports:

Councillor Wismer:

- Attended a PEPS meeting last week. Open Farm Days throughout Alberta will be held August 20 21. Farms can be registered for tours.
- Only 2 applicants from Castor entered the annual essay contest. No applications were received from Coronation. The criteria will change for next year. Prizes awarded for this year: One applicant will receive \$1,000.00 and the other \$500.00.

Councillor Ryan:

• Attended a Veterans Memorial Highway meeting. The pilot car project will move forward. Highway 881 will put together a book – hopefully to bring business to vendors along the highway. The book will contain ads, tourist attractions, etc. and be placed in all the gas stations along the route. The Veterans Memorial Highway Association is looking to do a similar project that would affect 27 communities along highway 36.

Councillor Nichols:

• Attended the East Central 911 meeting in Wainwright with the C.A.O. EC911 is in the process of installing next generation 911; one advantage is that they would be better able pinpoint locations. Rural Emergency – they will try to localize 27 fire departments. They promoted their after hour services (work alone and alarm monitoring). EC911 is looking at "Vetting" police calls where they will try and sort out real emergencies as opposed to less important issues. They are working with rural crime watch groups.

Councillor Zinger:

 At the last SMRWSC a motion was passed to accept money to take water to Brownfield and White Sands.

Councillor Elhard:

• Attended the Gas co-op opening this afternoon and a presented gift on behalf of the Town.

Foreman:

- Grayson is nearly finished, only the paving is left.
- No pavers arrived today as expected.
- Wally has a pressure test tomorrow. Bac T test is complete.
- Netook has first block off temporary water and they are working on hooking up temporary services for the second block. They are still finding plenty of black dirt.
- Cathodic checks being done on gas system this week
- Fire hydrant we helped hook up the water hydrant at the County shop.
- The crew has started trimming trees.
