A SKETCH OF PROPOSED WORK MUST BE PROVIDED

Culvert Requirements:

-Up to 30' width

-12" 16 Gauge Galvanized Pipe

-Gravel is to be 6" deep, 20' long, 30' wide

Note: Culvert and Gravel Must be installed and inspected before an approach permit will be issued.

Type – Residence, Business, etc.--

Minimum Requirement is 20' Wide Approach-Pipes over 40' in length require a cleanout.

Site Distance requirements for corner lots adjacent to intersections is 125' from the center of the intersection to the center of the approach.

Requirements for U Shaped Access or two adjacent approaches: 75' from the center to the center between approaches.

Fees and any Deposits **must** be paid up front. (See fee schedule)

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. If required by the Highway District, the permittee shall give at least _____ hour's advance notice prior to commencing initial work or any future work which would restrict the flow of traffic.
2. During progress of the work such barricades, lights and other traffic control devices shall be erected and maintained as may be necessary or as may be directed for the protection of the traveling public. Said barricades, lights and other traffic control devices shall conform to the current issue of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways.
3. In accepting this permit, the permittee, its successors and assigns, agree to hold the Twin Falls Highway District harmless from any and all liability on account of the erection, installation, construction, maintenance or operation of the facilities located under this permit.
4. Except as herein authorized, no excavation shall be made or obstacle placed within the right or way in such a manner as to interfere with the travel over said highway.
5. If the work done under this permit in any manner involves the disturbance of the traveled surface of the road and/or traffic control devices, said items shall be restored to the satisfaction of the Highway District at the completion of the authorized work either by the permittee or by the Highway District at the permittee's expense.
6. If the work done under this permit interferes in any way with the drainage of the driveway, the permittee shall wholly and at his own expense make such provisions as the Highway District may direct to take care of said drainage.
7. On completion of said work herein contemplated all rubbish and debris shall be immediately removed and the roadway and roadside shall be left neat and presentable and to the satisfaction of the Highway District.
8. All of the work herein contemplated shall be done to conform with current government and industry standards under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Highway District, and the entire expense of said supervision shall be borne by the permittee.
9. The Twin Falls Highway District hereby reserves the right to order the change of location or the removal of any structure(s) or facility(ies) authorized by this permit, said change or removal to be made at the sole expense of the permittee, or its successors and assigns.
10. All such changes, reconstruction or relocation by the permittee shall be done in such a manner as will cause the least interference with any of the District's work.
11. This permit or privilege granted under this permit shall not be deemed or held to be an exclusive one and shall not prohibit the District from granting other permits or franchise rights of like or other nature to other public or private utilities, nor shall it prevent the District from using any of its roads, streets, or public places or affect its right to full supervision and control over all or any part of them, none of which is hereby surrendered.
12. The Twin Falls Highway District may revoke, annul, change, amend, amplify, or terminate this permit or any of the conditions herein contained if the permittee fails to comply with any or all of its provisions, requirements or regulations as herein set forth or through willful or unreasonable neglect, fails to heed or comply with notices given, or if the utility herein granted is not installed or operated and maintained in conformity herewith.
13. The permittee shall maintain at his or their sole expense the structure or object for which this permit is granted in a condition satisfactory to the Highway District.
14. Neither the acceptance of this permit nor anything herein contained shall be construed as a waiver by the permittee of any rights given it by the Constitution of laws of the State of Idaho or of the United States.
15. Adequate drawings or sketches shall be included showing the existing and/or proposed location of the facility with respect to the existing and/or planned location of the highway improvement, the traveled way, the rights of way lines, and where applicable, the control of access lines and approved access points.
16. If trench or pavement settlement should occur within one year from the date of installation, repairs shall be made by the permittee as directed by the Twin Falls Highway District and at no cost to the Highway District.
