Opening Activities

Greg Mathieu welcomed all to the meeting and then led the opening prayer.

Approval of Minutes

The Minutes of the September 22, 2025 meeting which had been previously distributed in draft form were brought forward for approval.

Themes & Priorities – Pastor and Council

The discussion followed from the initial meeting of the Council at which each member was asked to bring forward their thoughts on what could be the main objectives of the new Pastoral Council in support of the parish mission. In summary, sustainability was felt to be an agreed upon objective although how it would best be manifested in its temporal and spiritual sense needed more discussion and review of the findings of the parish synodal process.

Father Adolphus noted that the Ottawa-Cornwall Diocese, in May of this year, developed a vision statement that may serve as a more defined theme with its recognition of the synodal process and the specific needs of the diocese. After further reflection and a more comprehensive explanation from Father Adolphus, the Council agreed to adopt the theme of Go Out – Go Deep – Go Together and to share that with the Ministries, Committees and organizations within our parish.

In a summary way of explanation, the theme encourages our parish to **GO OUT** – to help others know, love and serve the Lord, **GO DEEP** – through enthusiastic engagement, growth, and healing and **GO TOGETHER** - united in Mission and desire to respond to the needs of this generation and those to come (Vision Letter Attached).

While each of these areas will be built out more robustly over time, the Council and the Pastor share the belief that the establishment of a Youth Ministry / Faith Formation resource that focuses on building the presence of youth in our parish, is urgently needed. As such, the Council will look to developing the plan to implement this initiative and the resources needed to support its success.

A further point was noted that many of the existing Ministries and Committees could help shine a light on youth engagement through collaboration and sharing of their resources and expertise. While it would be a goal to have more volunteers in all areas to help with the various programs and activities, collaboration between existing groups can also bring synergy to the desired goal.

A final point in this area was the shared view that parishes, in general, can become isolated and walled off from other ideas and ways of supporting their parishioners. A defined approach to how St. Basil's liaises with other parishes, perhaps other religions, deserves further reflection and planning on the part of the Council.

Finance Council Liaison

As the appointed Pastoral Council liaison with the Finance Council (FC), Greg Mathieu attended the finance meeting on September 23, 2025.

Finance Council reviewed the collections to date noting that they had been ahead of the previous year in all months except August, which was 17% behind. The FC will continue to monitor the collections to ensure that the upward trend, which supports increased operating costs, is maintained.

The FC recognized Jim Shields who is stepping down from many years heading the Premises Committee. These many years of service are appreciated by the parish. Jim will remain on the FC at this time, and his Premises duties will be assumed by André St. Jacques who is also a member of the FC.

There are a variety of projects within the umbrella of the Under One Roof Campaign, some requiring immediate attention and others that are planned for the near future to ensure the physical plant of the church can meet the needs of the parish community. Without going into detail, such things as exterior lighting, electrical upgrading, drainage / leakage around rectory building in addition to the largest project, the new roof were all discussed in the context of the capital fundraising campaign. This will be reported on more fully by the FC.

The process for developing the 2026 parish budget was set out with the deadline for submissions being mid-November with a final budget meeting of the FC set for November 26th. The budget agreed to by the FC at that time would be presented to the Pastor for his approval and submission to the Diocese.

New Business

The Pastoral Council members agreed that Sunday, October 26th mass would be the date for the introduction and blessing of the members.

The Anniversary Photo Group picture was discussed with each of the October and November dates seeing members of the Council not available. We will try to have group photo taken on October 26th that will meet the standard for the directory.

Father Adolphus noted receipt of a letter from the Diocese regarding matters that required attention to the privacy of those involved. He sought the input of the Council on those matters and is now better able to respond to the letter he received in his early days as the Parish Priest.

Closing

The meeting concluded with Father Adolphus once again expressing his appreciation to the Council members for their willingness to serve the parish community in this fashion. He then led the meeting in a closing prayer.
