Introduction

The Strategic Plan (2026-2029) describes the areas which Council will focus on during their term and provides direction to Administration to plan and prioritize work and inform future budgets.

Development of the Strategic Plan was informed by the 2026 Interim Budget and Municipal Development Plan, as well as input received from the community through formal and informal opportunities. The plan is reviewed and updated by Council on an annual basis to ensure its relevance and to confirm Council's priorities.

Background

The 2019-2020 Strategic Plan was adopted on March 11, 2019.

With the expiration of the 2019-2020 Strategic Plan coupled with the 2025 municipal election, Town Council has developed this 2026-2029 Strategic Plan.

Vision, Mission, and Values

In looking towards the future of the Town of Castor, it is important that Council members agree on what the destination looks like. With this in mind, Council decided on the Town's idea long-term future (Vision) and the general direction it will take to achieve that future (Mission).

Vision

The vision is a high-level statement that expresses what the future looks like. Our vision has been crafted to be inspiring, energizing and motivating both internally and externally.

The Strategic Plan is intentional about the areas where focus must occur to advance our vision for the Town. It is a roadmap, guiding our vision for the future – a plan to get us from where we are today to where we want to be.

The Town of Castor is a vibrant, intergenerational community where people of all ages live, work and play.

Mission

Our mission statement communicates what we do and who we serve.

Through effective governance and collaboration, we provide residents with cost-effective services and programs to develop and maintain a safe, viable and vibrant community for all.

Values

The values expressed here, in alphabetical order, determine how the Town operates, both publicly and privately.

Accountability

Be responsible resource stewards by operating in a safe, efficient and cost-effective manner.

Collaboration

Seek out committed partnerships by building and maintaining strong relationships through mutual respect and open communication.

Serve our community by listening, engaging in prudent decision-making, and considering the best interests of the community. We encourage residents to take an active role in their community.

Transparency

Conduct Town business in public whenever possible. Council and administration operate in an open and accessible manner while still respecting privacy legislation.

Council's Advocacy Priorities

- Funding Options for Aging Water and Wastewater Infrastructure
- Overall Costs and Municipal Contributions under the Police Funding Model
