Community Volunteer Tax Program

The Community Volunteer Tax Program is a collaboration between the Selkirk Community Renewal Corporation (SCRC) and the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). SCRC hosts free tax preparation clinics and arrange for the volunteers to complete income tax and benefit returns for eligible individuals. The CRA provides the coordinators to guide the organizations as they delivers the program, and offers training and tax software for the volunteers. If you are a low income resident residing in the City of Selkirk, you may be eligible to participate.

Hop, Skip, Saturday

Hop, Skip, Saturday is a physical literacy program that provides parents and children with scheduled activities on the weekend through the fall and winter months. It is a 10 week program that gets families involved in indoor and outdoor activities. Our First Session ran from October 1st -- December 18th which included 12 families, 50 participants. SCRC also accepts and approves applications from local non-profit organizations for funding requests through our Small Grants Fund of up to \$2,500.

Small Grants Fund

SCRC provides grants up tp \$2,500 to local groups to support local projects that address the goals of the community plan.

Applications will be accepted on the following date: September 15th Projects must be completed by January 31st.
