Presentation Abstract

Unwanted noise emanating from HVAC systems is becoming a greater factor in achieving occupant comfort and satisfaction. Successfully achieving this acoustic comfort requires understanding and analysis from the design Engineer, along with proper selection and integration of noise control products, to produce a well-working HVAC system.







Introduction to our speaker

David Aquilina, P.Eng, has spent over 9 years in the noise control sector, covering such roles a laboratory product testing, Computational Fluid Dynamics, silencer design and development, along with integrated noise control system design ranging from commercial to heavy industrial projects. He has extensive knowledge of, and experience with, the behaviour and performance of duct silencers.

In addition to his time in noise control, David has spent 5 years in the consulting sector, designing HVAC engineered systems and Specification writing. In his current role at Kinetics Noise Control, Inc., David's responsibilities entail Product design and development, as well as custom noise control system design.

"Cleaning Up"

The final meeting of the 2014-2015 year was a technical tour of the Greater Moncton Sewerage Commission in Riverview. Following an overview of the process in the Operations Building, the group was split into two for the tour. The buildings are interconnected by service tunnels which link underground equipment rooms and allow access to all parts of the facility. Other features were noted:

- Sanitary sewage is collected from Moncton, Dieppe and Riverview, with a large tunnel passing under the river.
- A pumping station, located some 30 metres below ground, pumps the collected sewage to the inlet building where it passes through bar screens and then to aerated grit chambers.
- It then flows to three settling tanks (clarifiers) which allow suspended particles to settle to the bottom and the outfall is discharged to an outfall located downstream in the Petitcodiac River.
- Meanwhile, liquid sludge from the clarifiers is dewatered in centrifuges and after lime stabilization, the biosolids are suitable for use as a soil additive.

was one of the chapter's Board of Governors when the NB/PEI Chapter of ASHRAE was chartered on October 13th, 1973. A retired consulting engineer, his career spanned over 50 years. 



Other attendees participated in the **Technical Tour of the** *FirstOntario Centre*'s Chiller Room, Mechanical Room and Rink. The Hamilton Chapter took roughly 15 ASHRAE CRC attendees to visit the rink which was originally named Copps Coliseum. Built in 1985 the FirstOntario Centre houses a NHL size hockey rink. It can seat 17,383 people for a hockey game and 19,000 for a concert.

In 2014, a brand new NHL spec Ammonia refrigeration plant was installed in a new location in the building, to replace the rink's aging ice plant. The new ice plant offers a heat recovery option which uses Glycol Heat Exchangers. The building also has the ability to provide cooling/heating to a few nearby buildings.

We were able to visit the large Fan Rooms that supply fresh air to the building and also the large cooling towers located on the roof. During our visit, workers were preparing to install the ice surface for this coming hockey season.
