



The Senior Men's Snooker Christmas Party, better known as Blind Doubles, was held Thursday, December 18th. A total of 34 participants and 2 observers were involved.



Our thanks to Bill Kellas (Host) and Leigh Sherry (Assistant) for successfully running the event.








