FEATURED BOOKS OF THE MONTH

- **Bridgerton:the Duke & I by Julia Quinn** - a romance set in the Regency era, that currently is a Netflix series adaptation created by Shonda Rhimes
- **The Sanitorium by Sarah Pearce**- atmospherically chilling crime thriller, set in the snowy mountainous Swiss Alps about a haunted hotel, cut off from the civilization with the imminent blizzard!
- **The Russian by James Patterson (Michael Bennet#13)** - A killer crashes Detective Michael Bennett's wedding. It provides the NYPD homicide detective with a case that he must solve quickly.
- **The Rose Code by Kate Quinn**- heart-stopping World War II story of three female code breakers at Bletchley Park and the spy they must root out after the war is over.
- **The Perfect Guests by Emma Rous**- author of The Au Pair returns with another delicious, twisty novel--about a grand estate with many secrets, an orphan caught in a web of lies, and a young woman playing a sinister game.
- **All the Colors of Night by Jayne Ann Krentz**- Two psychics plunge into a dark world of deadly secrets in this second installment of the Fogg Lake trilogy
- **The Wrong Family by Tarryn Fisher** - a must read for thriller fans incorporating unexpected twists and turns
- **Blink of an Eye by Iris Johansen (Kendra Michaels#8)** - A very fast paced, FBI thriller, with action packed tension, suspense, & adventure.
- **Dolly Parton, Songteller: My Life in Lyrics by Dolly Parton, Robert K. Oermann**- As told in her own words; this explore the songs that have defined her journey. Illustrated throughout with previously unpublished images from Dolly Parton's personal and business archives.

FEATURED DVD MOVIES

- **The Croods: The New Age**- the prehistoric Crood family discovers an idyllic paradise, which they must learn to live and share with a family that's above the Croods on the evolutionary ladder.
- **Downhill**- A woman starts to have second doubts about her husband after he runs away from an approaching avalanche, leaving her and their two sons behind.
- **News of the World**- stars Tom Hanks who guides an abandoned child across the harsh plains of Texas – a long journey that turns into a fight for survival in the midst of America's Wild West era.
- **The Undoing**- a beautifully shot TV Series mystery, starring Nicole Kidman and Hugh Grant.
