Remembering Michael
Collins through Quotes

"The Big Fella" as he was affectionately known, Michael Collins was beloved by his generation and continues to be admired to this day. Ireland's revolutionary hero fought during the Rising in 1916 and would lead the Irish through the turbulent periods of the War for Independence and the Anglo-Irish Treaty. As civil war would break out, Collins would meet his fate on August 22, 1922, when he was assassinated at Béal na Bláth in County Cork. With passion and love for Ireland, Collins would utter many memorable words during his life. In a future article we will explore the life and times of Michael Collins. The following quotes will help us get introduced to this amazing figure in Irish history.

“He comes from a brainy Cork family.”

-From a British file in Dublin Castle that Collins himself found.

“There is no crime in detecting and destroying in wartime the spy and informer. They have destroyed without trial. I have paid them back in their own coin.”

-Collins commenting on Bloody Sunday, when his men gunned down British spies in Dublin.

“Of Pearse and Connolly I admire the latter the most. Connolly was a realist, Pearse the direct opposite. I would have followed Connolly to hell had such action been necessary. But I honestly doubt I would have followed Pearse...”

-On the 1916 Easter Rising.

“Lloyd George ... I find to be particularly obnoxious. He is all comradely, all craft and wiliness—all arm around the shoulder...not long ago he would have had me joyfully at the rope end.”

-ON LLOYD GEORGE, THEN-BRITISH PRIME MINISTER.

“Give us the future..we’ve had enough of your past..give us back our country to live in—to grow in..to love.”

-During the treaty negotiations with the British for Irish Independence.

“To me, the task is a loathsome one. I go in the spirit of the soldier who acts against his best judgment at the orders of his superior.”

-On being sent to Downing Street for the treaty negotiations with the British for Irish Independence.

“Think what have I got for Ireland ... Something which she

has wanted these past 700 years, will anyone be satisfied with this bargain, will anyone? I tell you this, early this morning I have signed my death warrant.”

-After signing the Anglo-Irish treaty. Collins knew the treaty would cause a civil war.

“In my opinion, it gives us freedom, not the ultimate freedom that all nations desire. but the freedom to achieve it.”

-His take on the treaty that would establish the Irish Republic with 6 Counties in the North held by the British (and still so to this day).

“Yerra, they’ll never shoot me in my own country.”

-Just before leaving to face his fate at Beal Na mBlath, County Cork.

“He was an Irish patriot true and fearless.”

-Winston Churchill about the man he once considered an implacable enemy.

Vegetable Jardinière

Online Culinary School

A jardinière is a mixed vegetable garnish served usually with a roast beef or other meat. You can use carrots, peas, turnips, green beans, potatoes and cauliflower. However, it is essential that the selected vegetables go well together.

Prep Time 30 mins
 Cook Time 25 mins
 Total Time 55 mins
 Course: Side Dish
 Cuisine: French

Servings: 8

Ingredients

- 0.25-pound onion, quartered and finely sliced
- 0.5-pound carrot, cut into Jardinière
- 0.5-pound potato, cut into Jardinière
- 0.5-pound turnip, cut into Jardinière
- 0.5-pound stalk celery
- 0.5-pound peas, fresh or frozen
- 0.5-pound green beans, trimmed to the same length as the jardinière
- 0.25-pound cauliflower, cut into medium size florets
- 1 small bouquet garni
- Salt and pepper, to taste
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 3 cups water

Instructions

1. Cut the Jardinière: Wash and peel the carrot and turnip and cut into, 4-millimeter-thick slices. Cut 3-centimeter lengths and then cut into 4-millimeter-thick batons.
2. Cook the Jardinière: In a large casserole, sweat the onions in butter without browning. Add the carrots and turnips. Cover with water, season with salt and pepper; add the bouquet garni, butter, and sugar. Simmer for 15 minutes.
3. Meanwhile, peel, wash and cut the potatoes to the same size as the carrot. Then add potatoes to the casserole and cook for about 10 minutes. 5 minutes before the end of cooking, add the peas, green beans, and cauliflower florets. Heat gently. Check

the seasoning. Almost drain all vegetables and serve hot.
