#### Prayer of Illumination

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 12:4-13

Reading (based on Acts 2:1-21)

When the day of the harvest festival called Pentecost arrived, those of us who were disciples of Jesus gathered together in one room. Suddenly, from the heavens, there came a sound like a wind rushing. It was a wild and furious wind.

It <u>rattled</u> the windows and <u>rattled</u> the doors.

The *wind* seemed to fill the entire house where we were gathered.

It <u>rattled</u> the table and <u>rattled</u> the chairs.

The wind swirled around us and unnerved us.

It rattled our arms and rattled our legs.

It rattled our knees and rattled our elbows.

It <u>rattled</u> our heads and <u>rattled</u> our hearts.

With the wind came dancing flames of *fire*.

They danced on our arms and danced on our shoulders.

Then the flames seemed to rest above each of our heads.

They danced on our heads and danced in our hearts.

The wild wind ceased, and the peace of the Holy Spirit settled upon us.

They danced on our heads and danced in our hearts.

Each of us began to proclaim the Good News about Jesus Christ. Each of offered the Good News in a different language.

Each of shared in languages we had never known before —

As the Spirit danced on our heads and danced in our hearts.

Then we got up and left that house. We moved out into the streets to share the Good News. People gathered to listen and each one received the Good News in their own language. By the power of the Spirit, we danced the Good News for them. We danced with our voices and danced with our words. We danced with our arms and danced with our legs. #### The Sacrament of Communion

#### <u>Invitation</u>

Faith glows like coals within our hearts. At this table, Jesus blows on those coals. Together, gathered as one, we are God's blaze of joy.

In our need you sent Jesus, conceived by the Holy Spirit.

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of God. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed are all who come in your name, and blessed is Jesus, your Christ, who taught and healed, who fed the hungry and included the outcast.

He breathed upon us his Spirit, renewing your Covenant to be with us always in love, and empowering us to love as he loved.

On the night in which he gave himself for us Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

"Take and eat; this is my body broken for you. Whenever you eat it. do so in remembrance of me."

In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, blessed it with thanks and gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you. This is my blood, poured out for the healing of the world. Whenever you drink it, do so in remembrance of me."

As long as we break this bread and share this cup we remember Jesus' death and resurrection, until he comes again.

Therefore, remembering these your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, as we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

Christ has died.

Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Pour out your Holy Spirit on these gifts of bread and cup, that they may be for us the body and blood of Christ. Pour out your Spirit on us, that we may be for the world the Body of Christ, one in your grace and aflame with your love, for the sake of the world. in the name of Christ.
