The Dominion Drama Festival came into being in October 1932 and the first Festival Final was staged in Ottawa in the spring of the following year. The Festival movement has reached a stature which prompted the Royal Commission on National Development in the Arts, Letters and Sciences to remark that "we have been impressed by the warmth and the extent of evidence agreeing that the Dominion Drama Festival is now established as an important national movement and as a unifying force in our cultural life." This year's Regional Festivals started in Corner Brook, Newfoundland, January 11, and conclude in Toronto, Ontario, April 2. The Final Festival is scheduled for Regina, Saskatchewan, May 9 to 14 with 8 plays chosen from 13 regions to participate.



## André Van Gyseghem

#### REGIONAL ADJUDICATOR

The Dominion Drama Festival is fortunate in having as its Regional Adjudicator this year Mr. André Van Gyseghem, experienced British actor, producer and lecturer. Mr. Van Gyseghem was trained at the Royal Academy of Dramatic Art and has produced a number of plays in London, Nottingham and Manchester. He has been an adjudicator and lecturer for the British Drama League, the Scottish Community Drama Association, Liverpool University (Shute Drama Lectures) and Nottingham University. As adjudicator for the thirteen regional drama festivals Mr. Van Gyseghem will decide which groups should get the Regional Calvert Trophies and cash awards.



## CALVERT TROPHIES

Three leading Canadian sculptors designed these Calvert Trophies
which are the top awards in the 13 Regional Drama Festivals
and the Festival Final. The trophies were executed in
distinctive woods to portray aspects of dramatic art.

They were designed under the direction of a special committee of the
Dominion Drama Festival and have become distinctive
contributions to Canadian art as well as trophies worthy

of the highest honours in Canadian drama.
